This Board met at the Gimm home in Sherwood on April 17, and discussed some goals for our Association and how we could best work toward achieving them.

We decided to contact Chambers of Commerce and Festival Committees in several cities about the possibility of having fiddle contests. Most of these would be those where there haven't been any oldtime fiddle contests. The concensus of the Board was that we should continue to promote and participate in fiddle shows also, because these too help to foster public interest in oldtime fiddling.

At this meeting the decision was made to get a special permit so that the Hoedowner could be mailed at a greatly reduced postage rate. The editor will

give details about this.

The Jamboree in Roseburg was more than well received. It was more comparable to giving a thirsty man in the desert a cup of cool water. The folks there were really enthusiastic about oldtime fiddling. We signed up many new members that day too.

Our regular Jamborees will continue in the northern part of the state, but we will be having some more Jamborees in the southern part too. These probably won't be every month, but should be at least every two or three months. These sessions will be important to the people there to promote and sustain interest in oldtime fiddling. To those of us farther north we can consider these as bonus sessions which we can take in occassionally, just as those of you who have joined from the southern area will try to come to a jamboree in the northern section once in a while.

The Oregon State Fiddling Contest will be held June 12th, 1971 in Gresham, at the Mt: Hood Community Collage. This will be a Weiser National Certified Contest, and will be held according to the National rules. There is enough parking room for five hundred cars at the College, so there should be no parking Problems.

There will be four divisions: LADIES, JUNIORS, SENIORS, AND OPEN.
Juniors must be under 18 years of age, and either male or female. Ladies
must be 18 years or older. Seniors must be 70 years or older. Opens must be
18 years or older and may be either male or female.

Judges will be out of state persons, qualified to judge a Fiddling Contest.

Contestants must be residents of Oregon.

There will be three cash awards and trophy's for the junior and ladies division. Four cash awards and trophy's for the senior division. And five cash awards and trophy's for the open division.

# FROM THE EDITOR

As wayne mentioned in the Presidents Wessage I am going to inform you of the Boards decision to try the bulk mailing system. There is a \$15.00 charge the first year, this is just paid once, then it is \$30.00 a year to keep the bulk rate. In other words it will cost us \$45.00 for the first year and \$30.00 a year afterwords. With this type of mailing it will only cost 1.6 cents per piece of mail instead of 6 cents. The postage rate will possibly go up in July and then the rate will be 1.8 cents per piece but the 1st class rate will go up to 8 cents per piece. We must also have a minimum of 200 like peices of mail per month. The board decided to try this for the rest of this year and if it dosn't work out, then we will discontinue it. As you can see this will amount to quite a savings in postage.

Due to the possibility of it taking longer for you to get your Newsletter, I must set a deadline of the 20th of the month for news to be in the Hoedowner. Again I would like to thank all the people who sent in news. I would also like to thank my family again.
