It required some exceptionally fine fiddling on John's part to win over such a good fiddler. Both of these boys are just 16 years old. Aaron Lowe, also of Spokane, took the No. 3 spot.

LADIES DIVISION: Vivian Skeens of Boise captured first place for the 2nd successive year, followed by Jana Greif the 2nd place winner last year too. A newcomer to the big weiser contest, Patsy Buckley of Moscow, Idaho, was third. A noteworthy aspect of the ladies contest was that the top three could just as well have been the top three in a beauty contest. They are lovely young ladies.

SENIOR DIVISION: Alvin Sanderson of Seattle repeated in winning first place. This made the 4th year in a row that he has succeeded in taking first in this division, and this is the first time anyone has ever won a top title 4 consecutive years. No. 2 spot was taken by Mr. Whittington of Idaho. 3rd was our own Charlie Johnson, Portland, and next another Oregonian, Cliff Buker of Waldport. 5th place was taken by Van Cunningham of California. Nell Turner of Amity. Oregon made front page news for being the first lady entrant in the Senior Division.
