THERE WAS A JAM SESSION IN MOSIER ON NOV. 17TH. MOSIER IS LOCATED SIX MILES EAST OF HOOD RIVER, BETWEEN THE BANK OF TEH COLUMBIS RIVER AND THE UP SHOOTING MOUNTAINS. THE POPULATION SIGH AT EDGE OF TOWN TELLS US THERE ARE 220 PEOPLE LIVIN THERE IN THE SCATTERED HOUSES MIDST THE SHELTERING TREES. ABOUT ONE- HALF OF THOSE FOLD TURNED OUT FOR THE FIDDLER'S JAM SESSION THERE ON NOV. 11TH. AND WHAT A JAM SESSION! THOSE PEOPLE THERE JUST LOVED IT AND THEIR ENTHUSIASM CERTAINLY INSPIRED THE FIDDLERS TO PLAY THEIR VERY BEST.
