Please remember that the chairman in each of the above districts is responsible for seeing there are enough fiddlers and accompanists at each show to provide entertainment for approximately 2 hours.

At long last the Oregon Old-Time Fiddling Project is about to produce some results. A photographic exhibit is about to start touring the state of Oregon, through the Statewide Services agency of the University of Oregon Art Museum. The exhibit will include about 70 photographs, and all participants in the project, as well as many other members of OOTFA will find their pictures there. Travelling with the exhibit will be several interesting and unusual fiddles, mostly from Lane County, Douglas County and Jacksonville museum collections. The exhibit will be accompanied by tapes of fiddle music from the project collection.

Right now, the exhibit is scheduled tentatively to open in Roseburg on Sunday, Aug 14, and in Jacksonville Thursday Sept 1. I am working with the museum directors and Martha Warwick to plan some specially scheduled jam sessions to celebrate the openings of the exhibit at those two museums, which have given much support to the project, and to make sure the fiddlers get a chance to see the exhibit.

The Roseburg session will be pretty much like Roseburg jam sessions always are: a good time at the fairgrounds on a Sunday afternoon. George Abdill, director of the Douglas County museum will be a special guest, and will formally open the exhibit at the jam session. The exhibit will stay at Roseburg for two weeks. After that it will move on to Jacksonville for another two-week period. The Jacksonville opening will take place the Thursday of campout week, if all goes as planned. So we're hoping a good crowd of fiddlers can go over from Warwick's to help celebrate this event. Bill Burk, director of the Jacksonville Museum, will be with us to open the exhibit.

All this is still a bit tentative, so look for confirmation of these plans in the August Hoedowner. Iane County Pioneer Museum will also hold an opening celebration, probably on a Sunday afternoon in late September. That will take care of all the special openings at museum involved in the project. But one other possibility remains: Michael Whitenack, director of Statewide Services, is trying to schedule the exhibit at the state capitol in Salem. If that happens, we'll probably be invited to give a special performance there (fiddling in the Rotunda!). Then the exhibit will continue to travel all over Oregon, to large and small towns, libraries, museums, schools, community centers, etc., for the next two years.

The purpose of the contest is to offer a national forum in which musicians of various backgrounds can compete and to provide the musicians and general public with a stomping good time! The Omaha Open will award \$10,000 in cash and trophies to the winning musicians. Three experienced judges will be hired from different parts of the country to jury the contest. No registration fee will be required to enter. There is also a reserved campground for contestants.
