family was living there during the Indian wars, and the grandfather and an uncle
helped bury General Custer and his men. It was here that Wes's parents were married.

The Brunson family moved to Cregon where Wes's father homesteaded in Columbia County. They moved to Newberg when Wes was quite young.

Wesley learned to play on his father's fiddle and played his first tune, an old church hymn, when he was 7 years old.

Wes possesses a fine natural musical talent and has learned to play several instruments. Besides fiddle, he plays guitar, mandolin, banjo and accordion. His favorites are fiddle and guitar. He joined the G.O.T.F.A. in March 1967.

Wes Brunson is a quiet, unassuming person with a keen sense of humor. Like all musicians, he loves to play, and is always willing to lend his talents to any occasion or group. His beautiful guitar harmonies add greatly to any musical rendition.

His many friends are looking forward to a rapid improvement in his health so that he can again take part in all the things he enjoys so much.
