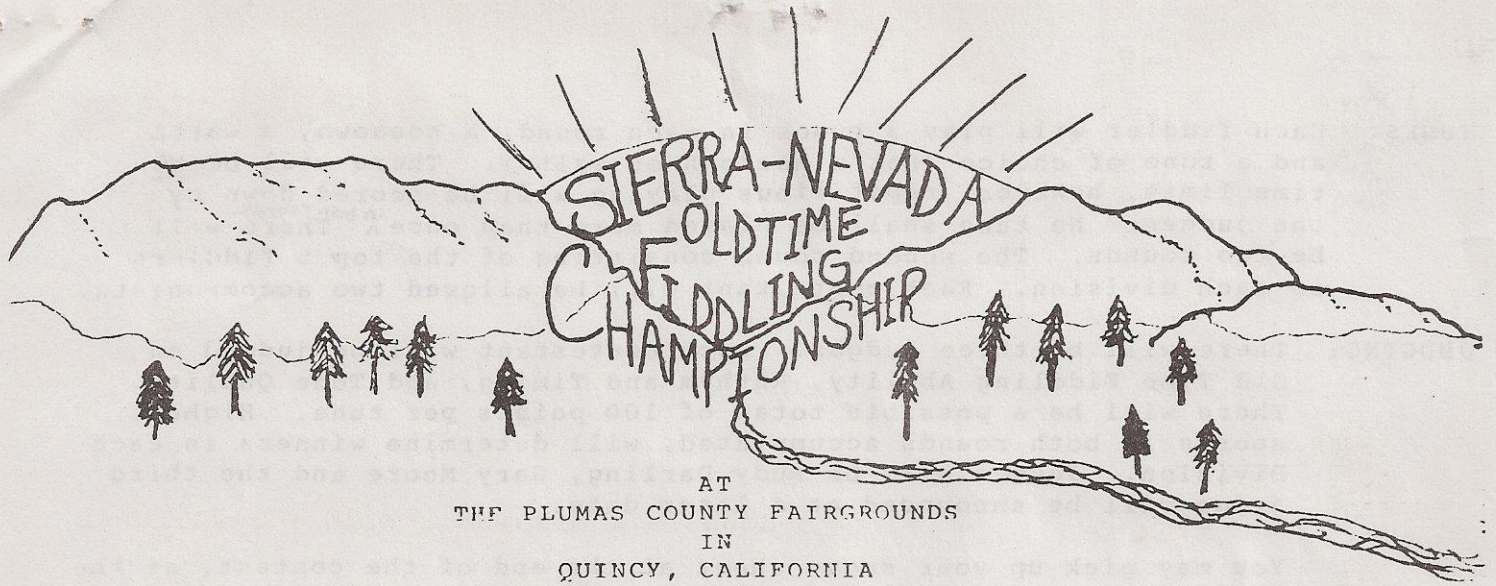

TUNES: Each fiddler will play 3 tunes in each round, a hoedown, a waltz and a tune of choice (not a hoedown or waltz). There will be NO time limit, however, repititious playing will be scored down by the judges. No tune shall be played more than once <sup>in both rounds.</sup> There will be two rounds. The second round consisting of the top 5 fiddlers in each division. Each contestant will be allowed two accompanists.

JUDGING: There will be three judges. Each contestant will be judged on Old Time Fiddling Ability, Rhthym and Timing, and Tone Quality. There will be a possible total of 100 points per tune. Highest scores in both rounds accumulated, will determine winners in each Division. Judges will be Rudy Darling, Gary Moore and the third judge will be announced at a later date.

You may pick up your score sheet at the end of the contest, at the registration table. All decisions of the judges are final.

ADMISSION: There will be a \$2.00 Admission Fee for the day program and a (Donation) \$4.00 Admission Fee for the Finalists Night Program. Children under 13 will be admitted free of charge. Young adults 13-18 will cost \$1.00. You may buy a package deal, day and night program for \$5.00.

WHERE: The contest will be held at the Plumas County Fairgrounds, Quincy, California.

CAMPING: There is a campground at the Plumas County Fairgrounds. There will also be a place where trailers and motor homes may hook up for a small charge.
