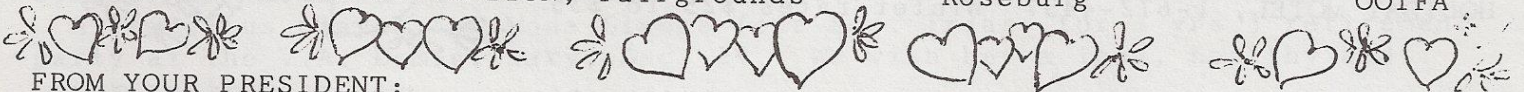

FROM YOUR PRESIDENT:

I will not be able to do all the things I promised in January Hoedowner but will do what I can and print the rest in the March Hoedowner. Look for Convention program then.

FIDDLE RAFFLE is well underway. Each Secretary has 50 tickets and can pick up more at the meeting in Florence. The fiddle has very good wood in it and the case is not bad. In a letter from its donor, GILES BROWN, of Stayton, he stated it should go for at least \$750.00. So, Districts, please get as many tickets sold before Convention, as you can. We will also sell chances there during the 3 days. Drawing will be at the Banquet on March 28th. BUCK MILLIGAN has more details.

STATE CONVENTION, March 26-28th, Roseburg Fairgrounds, is at the same time as the Roseburg Spring Fair, so all day parking and camping overnight will be on a first come bases. The Fairboard also informed me that the campground fee will be \$6.00 per site with NO Senior discounts! Those who need to be close can camp (in self-contained rigs) inside fenced area as last year. The fee will be \$3.00 and we must collect. (They will also keep count). Motels are available and DOROTHY HOUSTON, our Publicity person in Roseburg called in 3 motels and phone numbers closest to the Fairgrounds. I'll list them at end of report.

Chairman, JACK WALKER, is hard at work on the Friday VARIETY SHOW. There will be pre-jamming on stage that night and Jack will MC both groups.

MEMBERS, be sure and get your dues paid you you'll have your MEMBERSHIP CARD to show at the door for your free admission to the show. (No cards will be issued at the Convention unless pre-arranged with LEW HOLT). Admission for all others will be \$3.00 for adults and \$1.00 for children. Let's really push this show as the 'Best in the West'! It's our biggest source of revenue for the convention.

DRAWINGS: I hear LEW HOLT has already received 2 National Cookbooks from SHORTY DOW. Good start, Lew!

CONTEST: Just a couple of things on that. You all know we changed the format this year. If you forgot, read the January letter again.

One exciting change is the Friday night TWIN FIDDLE CONTEST on May 8th. If you plan to enter this event you must pre-register. Send \$5.00 per couple, names & addresses to GYNN DEATON before March 25th. Rules: 3 minutes time limit and no age limit. Prizes will be 3 places, \$50, \$40, & \$30 plus ribbons and we'll double the money if we get enough sponsors.

JUDGES COMMITTEE should have Judges' names ready to print in the April Hoedowner.

The business about out of state accompanists in the January HOedowner will have to be brought up at the State Convention. Due to my illness I was unable to follow through in time for printing this month.

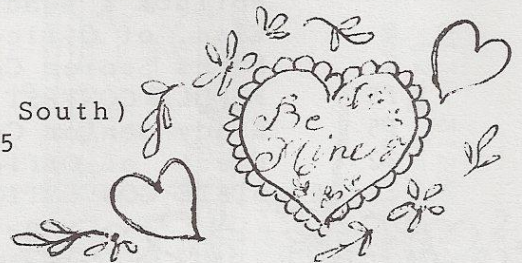

DISTRICT 4

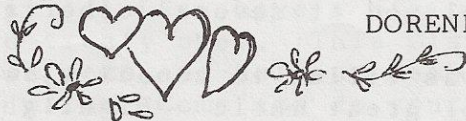

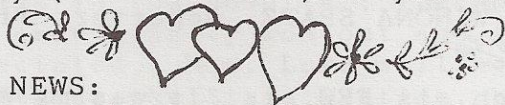

Bob & Leona Rasmussen had a car accident on their way to Arizona. Leona was hospitalized with four broken ribs, but is now back home in Hines recuperating.

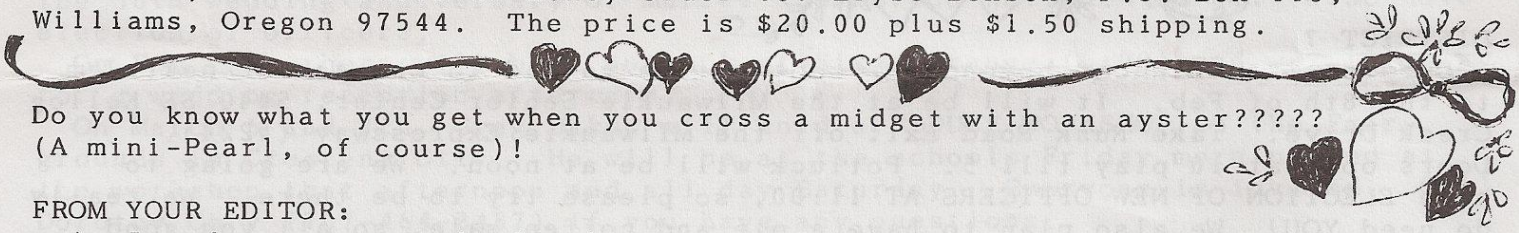

Over the Waves is a tricky waltz with several accidentals. Notice the low second finger in measures 2, 12 and 13, and the low first finger in measures 33 and 37. There is a C# accidental to watch out for in measure 16, also. Some fiddlers have difficulty going from the F sharp (tape 2) in measure 45 to the C natural (low 2) in measure 46. Practice this line carefully, then try the variations at the bottom of the page.
