

#### WHICH HAT TO WEAR

Part of what makes "people"so interesting is their varied professions, talents and interests. Those who play many musical instruments are admired and enjoyed. However, this sometimes presents a problem at a district jam.

For example, we have a member who sings and plays guitar, piano, fiddle, mandolin, banjo, ukulele, autoharp, dulcimer & clarinet. If he signed up to perform on each instrument, no one else would have a turn..no time. If your turn usually means two tunes (approx. 4 minutes) someone else could play for 15 minutes if they took turns on different instruments.

You may see some people on the stage several times during a jam, but as back-up for someone else's turn. Each person should have ONE TURN unless there are few performers and the MC goes through the list again. When you sign up, please decide then whether you want to sing or which instrument you wish to play, and THAT IS YOUR TURN. Feel welcome to play back-up with anyone else who asks you to, as THAT IS THEIR TURN.

This applies to the sign-up sheet, and not the GENERAL JAM at the beginning of the program. At that time all are welcome to play and the MC will choose at random who is to lead the group. Since all have the opportunity to play at this time, and most fiddlers to "lead" a tune, this does not constitute a "turn".

So YOU decide which "hat to wear" and which instrument to play for YOUR TURN. If there is extra time left at the end of the jam, the MC may ask you to perform on another instrument, but this will be his perogative. Let's be fair to everyone else.....and keep on playing!!!
