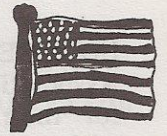

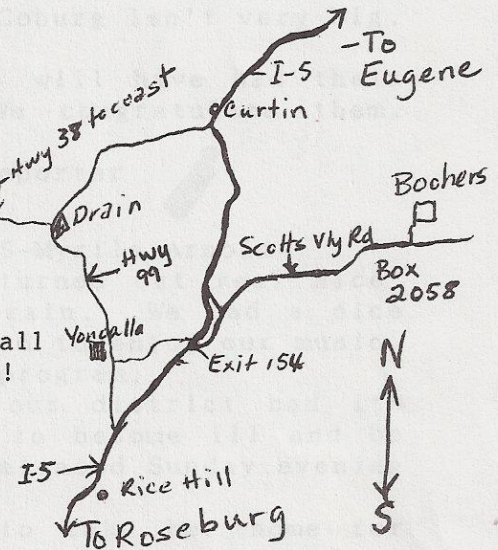
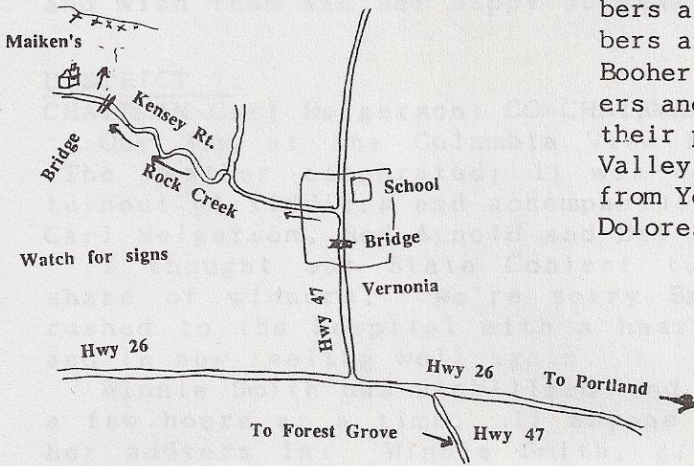

We have just learned that Curly Roberts has recently returned home from

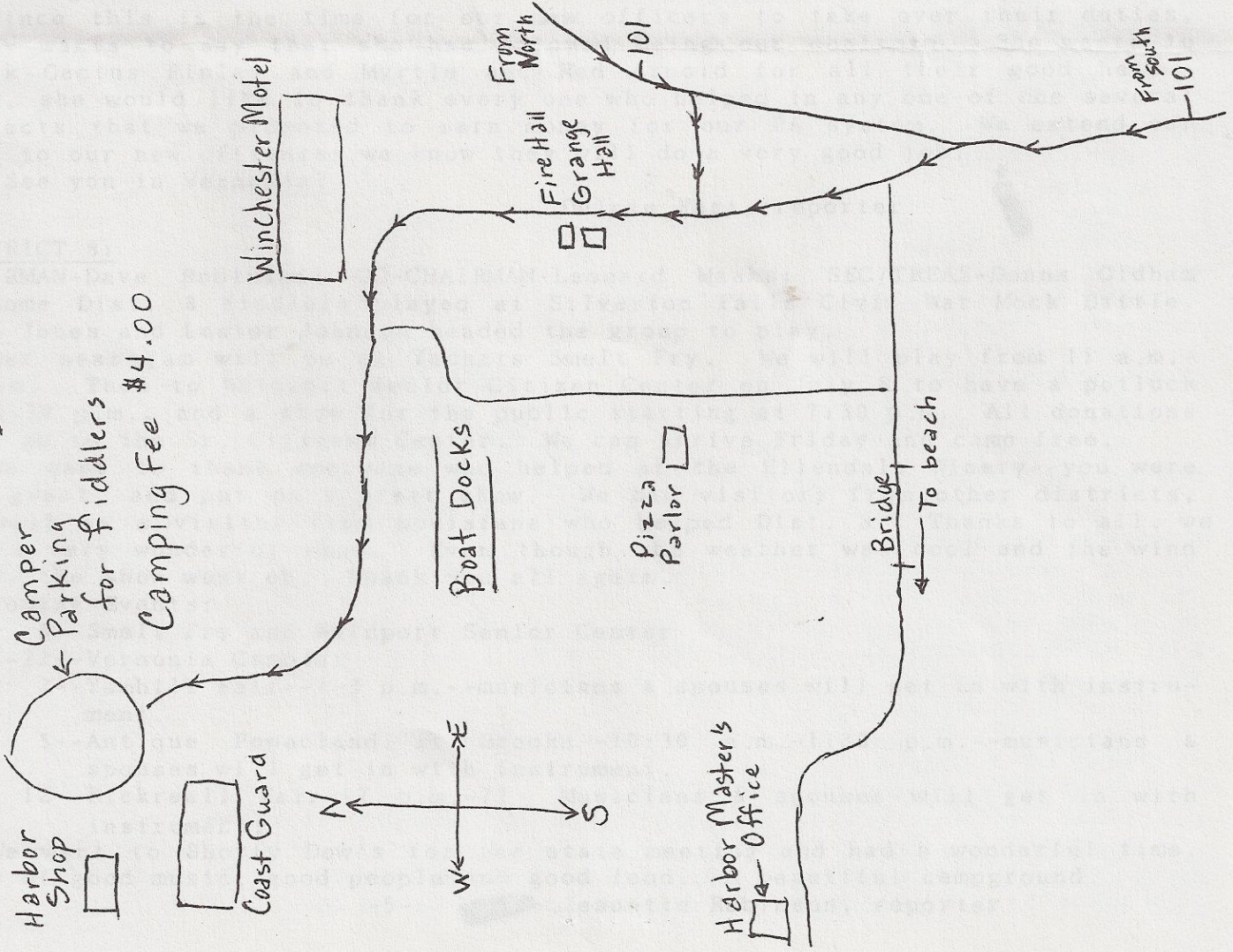

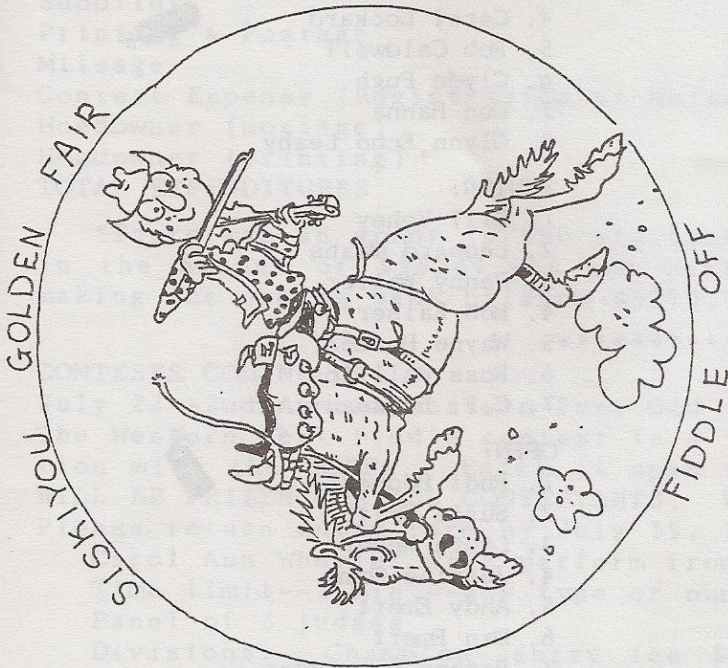
