I have good news for you. The first 80 years are the hardest. The second 80, my experience shows, is a succession of birthday parties.

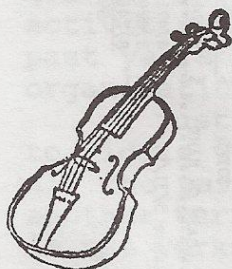
