

- 4. If there are any complaints, you must bring them to the Contest Chairman within three hours and signed by not less than three other contestants that are involved.
- 5. All decisions of Judges and Contest Committee will be final.
- 6. Contestants may play without accompanist or with not more than two, except the Twin Fiddle-Division.
- 7. Contestants of each appearance must first play a hoedown; second, a waltz; and third, a tune of their choice other than a hoedown or waltz. No tunes shall be played more than once during all appearances of a contestant. Four minutes playing time will be strictly adhered to. Ten points will be deducted from total score for each 30 seconds interval or portion thereof.
- 8. Any danceable tunes played in oldtime fiddle fashion are acceptable.
- 9. Contact microphones and amplified instruments will not be permitted.
- 10. No trick or fancy playing allowed during the contesting appearances.
- 11. Judging of all Divisions except Twin Fiddling will be scored for Oldtime Ability.
- 12. Rules Governing Championship Division:
 - a. The Championship Division will include contestants who have placed as follows:
 - 1. In top twenty (20) of the Championship Division at Weiser, Idaho.
 - 2. In top three (3) of the Championship Division of a Certified Regional Contest.
 - 3. In top five (5) of any State Championship.
 - 4. Any person who wins the Oregon State Young Adult, Adult, or Senior division for two (2) consecutive years must either play in the Championship Division for one year or serve as a judge for the Oregon State contest before competing again in their age division.
 - 5. Any other contestant who feels qualified may enter.
 - b. Any contestant who wins the Championship Division three (3) consecutive years may not compete the following year.
