


Our October meeting was held at the Senior Center. Had a good crowd and lots of dancers. **Dave** and **Dorene Winkelman** from Medford were our guests.



Personality Spotlight

WAYNE HOLMES STORY

My dad's family came from what they call "The Sand Hill Country" of Northwestern Nebraska. Granddad Holmes settled in Walterville, Oregon and soon after that my dad moved to Eugene, where I was born and grew up. Dad's younger brother Isaac, who everyone called "Ike", of course, taught me a few tunes on the fiddle when I was 8 years old. Why he picked on me, I don't remember, but he did. After a few weeks I could play the 7 or 8 tunes he knew, as well as he could. He had mixed feelings about that. On the one hand he felt a bit peeved because an 8 year old kid could pick the tunes up so fast, and on the other he was proud that I could play fairly well after such a short time. After playing for five years by ear, my mother decided that she wanted me to learn to play the violin, so she took in washing for the teaching, because money was scarce in those days, in the early 1930's. So I learned to read music and from then on played first violin in school orchestras.

In 1968, I attended a fiddle contest in Cottage Grove, Oregon, which they used to have in connection with Bohemia Mining Days, got interested in fiddling, joined the Oregon Old Time Fiddlers Association, and have been active in it ever since. I will say that there seems to be something about this oldtime music that attracts the best people in the world, because I have met so many hundreds of them in the last 25 years.
