

We had a lovely Christmas party on the 11th. **Evelyn Peterson** did a fine job of preparing the turkey, etc. Everything was delicious.


We wanted to stay at the Merrill Recreation Hall for our monthly meetings.

play music....or is it that you have to play music to keep healthy. What ever it is, you all work on it! Happy Fiddlin'.


