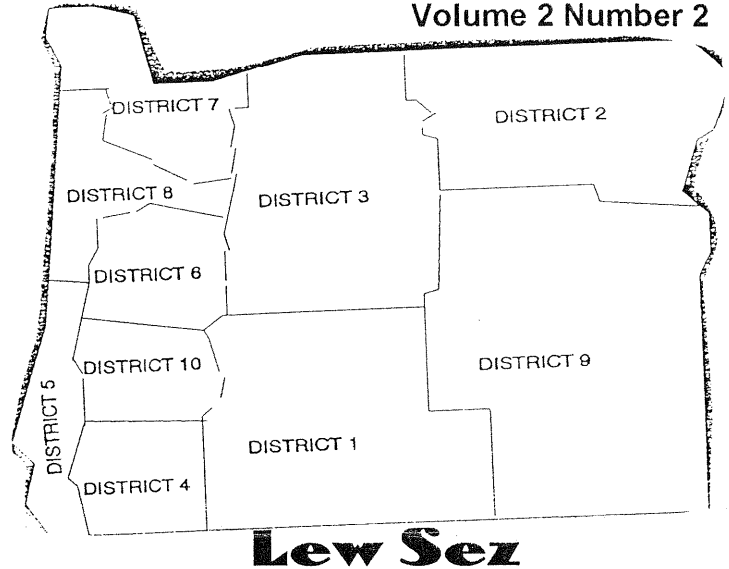

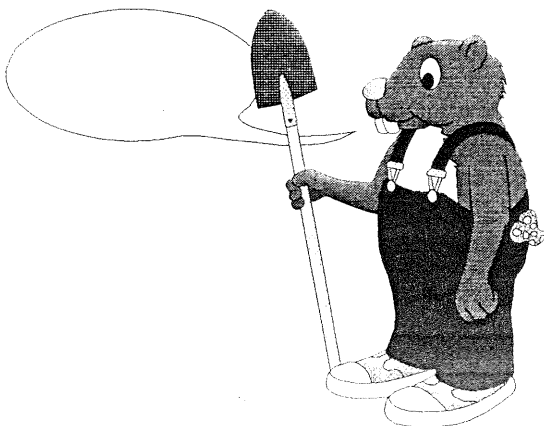

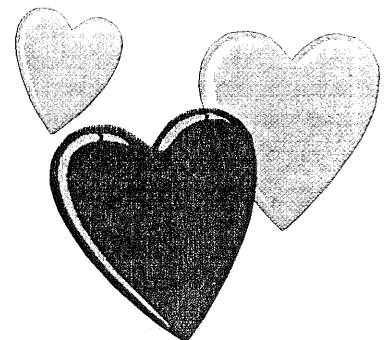
Election of officers will be held prior to the March 9th jam. Please be thinking about any office you might want to hold.

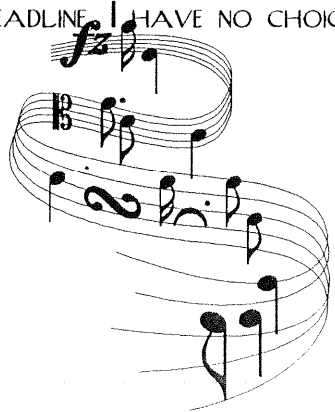
NOTES FROM YOUR EDITOR

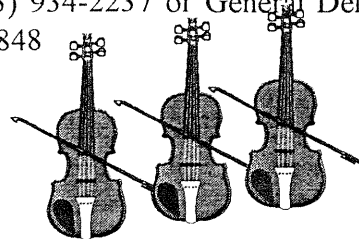
LETTERS TO THE EDITOR
