



THE PROBLEM OF NOT HITTING THE NOTES "RIGHT ON" BUT GETTING THEM SHARP OR FLAT.

It seems to me, that if one cannot <u>hear</u> whether one is "right On" or sharp or flat, the only way one can correct the problem would be to practice scales in whatever key one wants to play in until you can at least tell by the <u>position of your fingers</u> that you are hitting the notes exactly where they ought to be.

PLAYING ALONE. Practicing alone should be limited, if possible, to exercises and scales. Such things as mentioned above, trying to correct not hitting the notes exactly where they should be. Avoid playing alone, if nothing else, play along with tapes and records. Play with others and play with accompanists as much as possible. Many of the bad timing problems could be avoided if the fiddler could play frequently with accompanists.

WHEN YOU GET REAL BRAVE, RECORD YOUR-SELF AND LISTEN TO YOUR PLAYING. This goes for practice you do at home or when you are at a jam or a show.

REMEMBER THAT PLAYING THE FIDDLE WELL IS NOT EASY. YOU CAN LEARN WHAT SHOULD BE DONE, BUT STILL FIND IT DIFFICULT TO ACTUALLY DO. The longer a person does something in one certain way,

the harder it is to change to doing it in another way. One might come to realize that instead of playing the fiddle weakly and lackadaisically one should play it powerfully and dynamically, but making oneself do it requires tremendous determination and energy.

SET REALISTIC GOALS. Unless you want to be a contest fiddler, set you sights on just seeing how well you can play, with the talent given you, and not attempt to attain supersmooth contest type of playing. This frees you to play just the kind of oldtime music you want to play, not the kind that everyone thinks will win contests.

WHERE ON THE BOW SHOULD ONE PLAY? Use <u>all</u> the bow to play waltzes. Use only the upper half to play hoedowns and other tunes. I would say a general rule would be: The faster the tune, the more you would restrict the use of the bow to the upper part of the bow. On a tune like "Devil's Dream", for example, you should use only the upper quarter of the bow. The rapid changes from one string to another are more easily done by using only a very small length of the upper part.

TRY TO MAKE ALL ACCENTED NOTES ON A DOWN BOW. Reason: a down bow is easier to accent.

EVERY FIDDLER SHOULD BE ABLE TO TUNE THEIR FIDDLE, AND ALWAYS MAKE SURE IT'S IN TUNE WHEN YOU PLAY IN A GROUP OR INDIVIDUALLY.

LEARN A NEW TUNE <u>EVERY</u> YEAR. IF YOU WANT TO BE BOLD, LEARN TWO!







OREGON'S FESTIVAL OF AMERICAN MUSIC


