

The January quarterly meeting on the 14th was attended by **Shorty Stone**, **Mary Anne and Larry McLain**.




I was really pleased to get all the reports in by the deadline. That gives me lots of time to do the typing.

So attend the meetings regularly, And help with hand and heart, Don't be just a member But take an active part.


