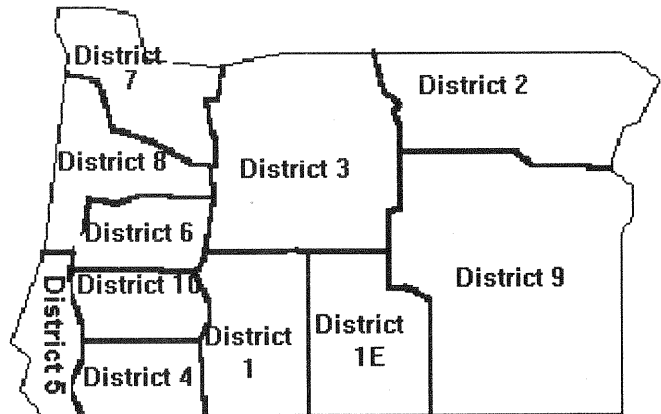

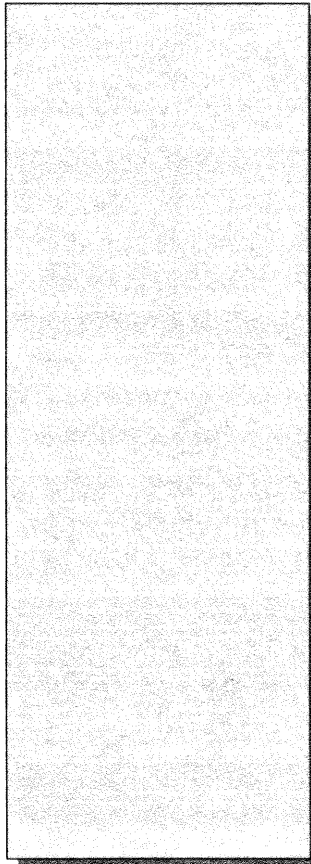
Remember -- Dist. 4 will ride in the Central Point Parade on July 4th. Meet at Crater High before 10 A.M.

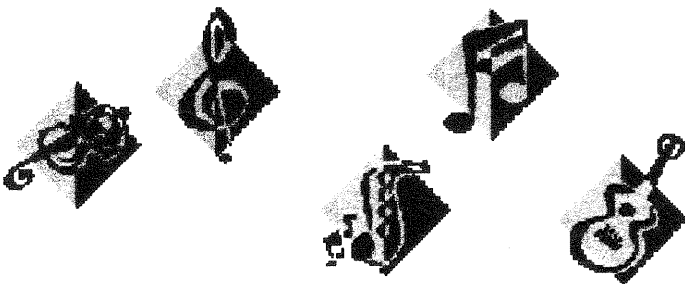

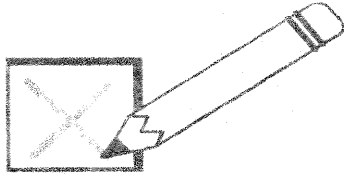

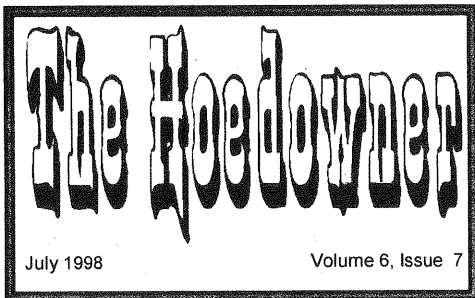
