



Notes from the editor:

Last month I wrote about our meanderings 10 or 15 years ago. Here's the rest of the story: We drove on to Lakeview and had an equally good time there. Where else could Alice and I have had such a good time. We jammed at Homer's place, we jammed at the fairgrounds and we iammed at the jam on Sunday (still have a tape of it) and we visited the fire hall and police station where Homer worked. Then Monday morning Homer loaded us into his pick up and took us for a little drive. That "little drive" was over 100 miles to the south east, down into Nevada where we saw hot springs coming up out of the ground and the wild burros grazing in the sage brush. The part I remember the most is that on the way back, it was getting closer and closer the time for Homer to be back at work. I remember going "full speed ahead" down this highway which clung to the side of the mountain with the bottom of canyon many hundreds of feet below and Homer telling us about his heart attack several years earlier. OOTFA Members -- We are the fine association that we are today because of traditions established over the years by fiddlers and their families. Many of the fiddlers who established the foundation of our association are gone. Bob Fast recently had his 80th birthday. I want to take this opportunity to give you information that will give you a chance to better know Bob Fast, one of our fine old time fiddlers. I had asked Bob for the following information so I could send it to a fellow I write to in Missouri who had asked me about Bob. I called Bob for permission to share it with you.

Dear Friend.

I was born in Knox Co., Mo. - 10 miles East of LaPlata in 1918. I spent most of my life around Kirksville which is 80 miles North of Columbia, 30 miles South of the Iowa line and 80 miles West of Quincy, Illinois.

My father, Chrisley Fast, was a good old time fiddler. He had me chord on an old tenor banjo, tuned up like a five-string with out the fifth string. I only played 3 changes for each key that the piece was played in. We played for old time country dances in different homes when I was only 8 years old.

I took a few lessons from a college professor but couldn't afford but a few lessons. After that I dropped the fiddle and didn't play it for many years.

My wife, Dulcie, and I came to Portland in 1943 and I worked in the ship yards. In 1945, we moved back to Kirksville and later lived in Quincy, Illinois for 10 years. We found some of Tommy Jackson's fiddle records at a library. I played a lot on my mandolin with the records.

When we moved back to Portland in 1962, we were camping and fishing on the Deschutes River at Maupin. This Saturday night I heard the National Contest at Weiser, Idaho over the radio. After that, I drug out my Father's old Hopf fiddle and started practicing again. The next year we went to Weiser and I thought it was the greatest thing I'd ever seen.

Since then, most of my tunes were learned from records. The tunes that my father played were very old and I've forgotten the names of those tunes. He played most of the old standard hoedowns. I'm still trying to learn new tunes. I've composed a few tunes which I hope some people will enjoy.






