
Wescott Fiddle





he was. He told me that the family had a picture of their grandfather with a fiddle with an inlaid village on the back.

In the package yesterday was a fine, large photo of the builder with the fiddle. It is the fiddle that I own. The photo must have been taken shortly after the fiddle was built. My reasoning for contacting the family was to try to acquire a picture of the builder -- maybe of an old man standing in front of a house -- never dreaming that I would get such an exact photo.

The Wescotts who participate in the web site are excited because they did not know about the fiddle or the

picture or of the grandson. His father died when he was two years old. The grandson went to Alaska 41 years ago to "climb mountains" and to do graduate work. He now has a Ph.D. in geology. During this time he basically hasn't had contact with the Wescotts.

Hopefully there will be one more chapter to my story when and if I am given specific information about the fiddle from 1876 to about 1936 when the fiddle was sold for money because of the depression. I don't know if I ever will be able to find the story of the fiddle from 1936 to 1997. But I would like to and I will try.

Notes from the Editor

We take in \$1.25 a month for your dues and the Hoedowner has been costing maybe 50 cents more than that. That isn't good business - so - to be more realistic we have had to make some changes. We like the flat Hoedowner but that automatically increases the postage to 55 cents. If I/we get too wordy, the extra pages increase the weight of the Hoedowner over an ounce which adds extra postage even if we fold the Hoedowner. Realistically, there are two things that can be done to get the cost down to a more realistic figure. 1.) Fold the Hoedowner and 2.) get the weight down to less than an ounce.

Folding it is easy. Now how do I/we get it to less than an ounce? Cheryl will experiment this month and can work out something. I can become "less wordy" with my stories. I can shorten your letters to me that I share when I quote them and get to the point. We could leave out the map on the front page. No little decorations or pictures. No Smaller font in white space. places. Leave out the gray boxes. I will be sending extra material to Chervl. She will work it in - only if there is room. So while we are working out the details, please be patient with us. Pres. Roger has the Hoedowner on the agenda for our annual meeting. We'll discuss it at the meeting and evaluate what we

are doing and what we need to
