



OREGON STATE FIDDLE CONTEST: The Crossland Motel is near the contest. You are encouraged to make your reservations now. The starting price is something like \$37 for a single. It is located at 3535 Fisher road, NE Salem 97305. Phone: (503) 363-7557. Be sure to identify yourself as being from the Oregon Old Time Fiddlers Association for the contest. The directions for getting there are; From I-5, take Exit 256 (Market St.) go East to Lancaster Ave. Turn left (north) on Lancaster to Silverton Rd. (1.3 miles) Turn left onto Silverton Rd. They address the following letter to the contestants: "A letter to the fiddle contestants. We are writing this because we have heard some good fiddle players beat themselves in the play off.

My wife, Lois, and I have been the timers at the State fiddle Contest for several years and we have overheard comments made by the judges about fiddle players that play a fast tune and sluff over some of the notes. It seems that when two players have to play to break a tie that they will play a fast tune for the tie breaker and consequently some notes get sluffed over. Be precise with your notes.

If you have a tape recorder, practice your tunes and when you play them back, listen for imperfections and time the tunes. We have heard good players run way over on the time and get points deducted.

Play tunes you know well and that you can play perfectly, even if they are old tunes. The judges are accomplished musicians and they will hear notes that are not played well.
