


Hi and Happy Holidays. Winter snow and icy roads abound in our area now. Some of our members have been and still are hunting. We wish them good luck.

Arnold Jorgensen was in the hospital. Vic Flood fell and injured his back, spent several days in the hospital, but is back home with hospice care.



December anniversary congratulations are in order for: Bob & Jerene Shaffar the 17th, Charlie & Clarica


Miller the 20th and Del & Clara Thomas the 22nd.

gratulations, Louie.


