Betty Trombatore, wife of our visitor John Trombatore wrote an article for the Bulletin Paper in Bend about OOTFA District #3. I would like to share this article with OOTFA.

"Oregon Old Time Fiddlers Association plucks the heart strings in Redmond. Don Hanna is at the microphone now. "...songs 50 years or older," he says as the musicians glide into When My Blue Moon Turns to Gold. About 15 to 20 couples dance around and across the Parquet floor of the Redmond VFW Hall. One older couple slides by, lithe and confident. His arm supporting her back, he steps easily as she relaxes into his careful moves each depending on the other just as they have for all the years of their marriage.

The Oregon Old Time Fiddlers Association in Central Oregon has 80 member families. It is one of ten such associations in the state. By the spring of 1980, The Oregon Old Time Fiddlers Association had enough members to establish its own district, District 3. Bob Ervin is its current Chairman and Hanna is Vice-Chair. The cost for the whole family is only \$15 per year. Only non-amplified instruments are allowed. Stringed instruments of any kind are permitted, such as mandolins, guitars, and fiddles. While harmonicas are allowed, horns are not.

As a hundred or more sit and watch the dancers, old and young, the band leads into Waltz Across Texas. A half a dozen young women in jeans and tennis shoes dance around the floor. It is as if the heart and ears crave the strains of music from a simpler time, the steady easy to understand lyrics, the music from the bass fiddle to the piano, the guitars and fiddles and the sweetness of the husky vocal chords.

One of the youngest members of the association is 13-year-old Cody Doolan. He loves to play music, he says. He loves playing with the older members of the association. He plays the fiddle, and the banjo. An eighth grader at High Desert Middle School he's active in 4-H, skis, and plays roller hockey on his school team. It's a great learning experience, he says about the picking and fiddling.

Ervin and Hanna both agree. Old time fiddling is disappearing. That's why they have a scholarship program for any interested young person who would like to continue the history and tradition of old time music. They have high hopes for Cody with his enthusiasm, good looks and love of music, old time music that is.

The purpose of the association is to preserve old time music or songs that are fifty years or older. That's the music that's part of America's history. It came out here with our forefathers with the wagon trains, Hanna and Ervin insist. Both men participate on stage at the monthly meeting and performance of the Oregon Old Time Fiddlers Association. They both practice every day at home. We like it, Hanna says. It's like preserving anything that is part of history. Old time music is beautiful and complete and has a style all of its own, just like a well-built old building. I love this kind of music, Carole Urell says. I come here every month, she says as I'll Fly Away starts up.

Members and performers Ellen and Dennis Jakab found the Oregon Old Time Fiddlers Association by accident. I couldn't believe it, says Dennis. They were playing the kind of music that we like. Being able to play with others and to play on stage helps beginning musicians get over their stage fright. It encourages practice and maintains the importance of older music.

The dance floor at the Redmond VFW is large and subtly lighted. It has a smooth comfortable surface. The stage is set back into a far corner of the room. Tables are set up for those who want to eat the food provided at a small charge by members of the VFW. As you enter a donation is requested by Old Time Fiddlers Association. They are able to, narrowly, pay for the cost of the hall by the generosity of the audience.

The Oregon Old Time Fiddlers Association performs the first Sunday of the month from 1:30 to 4:00 PM at the Veterans of Foreign Wars Hall, Sisters Ave., Redmond."

March 8, 1986 Dear Mom,
