Homer Delbert McLain died at his Lakeview home on Saturday, Dec. 27, 67, from natural causes. Homer was born to Homer LeRoy and Alma (Tuttle) McLain at Newport, Wash. on Oct. 21, 1936. He moved to New Pine Creek in 1941 and attended Kelly Creek School and Lakeview High School. He married Rosa Lee Maxwell on April 5, 1957 in Carson City, Nev.

Homer worked as a ranch hand in Adel, New Pine Creek, Merrill and Crooked Creek. He also worked in the saw mill at Canby, Calif. and L.P. in Lakeview and was a fireman, dispatcher and 1st responder for the Lakeview E.M.S. for 22 years. He always enjoyed his jobs and the people he worked with.
