Six months ago, I got an email from some people in Pennsylvania who had acquired a fiddle from a yard sale and they were doing some research on the name inside.

They did a google search of the Cartwright name and my name kept coming up. A.E. Cartwright was the name of my grandfather and the name inside. What did I know about it?

My grandfather died when I was a young man -- out of the service and travelling. I never acquired one of his fiddles and always lamented that I'd give a lot to have one. He was not an exemplary fiddle maker, but he was my hero and my surrogate father, so anything by him would have been appreciated.

When I saw the name and the place of construction, I was a little too enthusiastic. They wanted a lot of money for the fiddle. I protested and told them that aside from the fact that it was a family instrument, it had a possible resale value of \$300 and that's all I would pay. They said no and that they would place it on Ebay, which they did. I watched the placement and the sale and it never even reached minimum.

I was concerned that I had made the wrong decision and that it had gotten away from me again. Time went by and I sent them a email about the instrument and a couple of weeks ago they contacted me and asked if I was still interested in it at \$300. I said I was and bought it. I'm in the process of repairing it and making it ready to play. I'm so excited by having it that I can hardly wait to strike a bow to it.
