From the Prez: Hi Folks: At the High Desert Jamboree at Burns in June during our quarterly board meeting the financial report for the preceding quarter was read. This was very disturbing to me and I think many others, as it showed that we had to use part of our \$10,000 C.D. to pay our bills that were due. After some discussion with our then Sec/Treas. Irene Ruddock, I decided when I become President I would appoint a finance committee to see what could be done. This I did. On this committee are: Hal Weiner ,chairman, Roger Germundson, Fred Hardin, and Ruel Teague. All business persons whom I felt were qualified to tackle this. Thank you gentlemen for accepting this very important job. This committee along with the three State Officers had their first meeting at Thousand Trails, they came up with some very good ideas, I would say it was a very successful first meeting and a good start. The committee will meet twice more before the Convention. At this time they should have some suggestions to present to the membership. There will be changes, which I hope over time will greatly improve our financial situation.

As we all should know by now the Hoedowner is our largest single expense, so we felt this would be a good place to start. Depending on the number of members it costs approximately \$15,000 to \$18,000 per year or around \$1300.00 per month. This is quite a large sum. There are ways to cut these costs if we are willing to make some changes. The membership dues are suppose to finance the Hoedowner. However at this time that is not happening and hasn't for quite a long time. The Finance Committee suggested raising our dues from \$15.00 to \$20.00 to cover this cost. Also, we are asking our district reporters, also the President and the Editor to keep their reports to 500 words or less to save on pages in the Hoedowner. They also suggested that we reduce the font which would also save space on each page. Another suggestion was for people who receive the Hoedowner on the Internet to volunteer not to receive it be mail. {strictly Voluntary}This would save a bundle. Another thought was to switch from 1st class mailing to bulk. It costs 35.5 cents for 1st class and only .17 cents for bulk. This would save over half on the mailing cost. Also, there are ways to save on the Contest and the Convention. These we are considering. None of us like to do these things but if we are to stop the downward slide of our bank balance and eventually replace the \$5000.00 we used from our C. D. we must make some hard choices now.
