Hi everybody. I just wanted to let everyone know there has been some new developments in my negotiation with Thousand Trails. As you all should know by now, last fall Thousand Trails informed me that the new rate for the RV spots there would be \$32.00, of course I told them I didn't think our members could afford this. Anyway from then until now we have been dickering back and forth and this is the outcome and their last offer. I think it is one we can live with. They have said if we would guarantee them that 20 spots would be reserved for two nights they would let us have them for only \$24.00 a day. This should be no problem because we have continually had more

reserved spots than this. That would be an \$8.00 decrease from their original offer. I think this offer is in the ballpark as far as price goes. I know of two parks in Bend that are \$45.00 And \$30.00 with hook-ups and one or two that are less than \$24.00. Anyway I wanted you all to have this information to think about.

I have also communicated with Irene Ruddock and she tells me if we would decide to move to Merrill, OR. that there are RV parks there with reasonable rates: Motel Mobile Manor Full hook-ups----\$15.00 per night 6 spaces

Merrill Motel--- \$40.00 per night. Cabin with 3 rooms and kitchen-- 2 with double and 1 with twin and double. 2 baths \$18.00 per person. 2 cabins with queen size beds \$50.00 a night plus tax. They have a few spaces to park RVs and a dump site.

However, if we were to decide to move to Merrill which is South East of Klamath Falls, I am sure most of you would use more than \$3,00 worth of gas getting there. \$3.00 is the increase over last years rate for an RV spot at Thousand Trails. Think it over carefully. See you at the convention.

LD: Yes, he is good.

EW: 'Course, we've lived down there and saw Billy grow up, he's a little kid you know, runnin' around there scratchin' on the fiddle seven or eight years ago and he's just terrific, real good.
