

One day I played Laura's fiddle for the kids there. Fiona was fussing and thrashing around, but they insisted that she get up and put her hands on the fiddle. Finally she complied, and what happened was amazing. She could feel the vibrations as I played and began bouncing and clapping in time to the music. Then she would reach back for the fiddle again, then bounce

some more. Eventually she found the scroll and put it in her mouth -- of course! I just thought to myself, "Laura, you're going to have to forgive me for letting this kid chew on your scroll. It's worth it!" (She did forgive me.)

The next day I played again and -- even before feeling the instrument, Fiona began clapping and dancing! Whoa! That's powerful! It was the breakthrough they'd been waiting for. I so wanted to stay on there and watch her develop. Obviously, there's much more work to be done in helping her connect with the outside world, but at least now, there's an opening. They know that she can hear at least a little. It was a precious experience!
