

From the Prez: My fellow members,

We are now well into the new year and I expect some of you made some New Years resolutions which have by now been cast aside. They are so easy to make, but so hard to keep. However, there is one resolution I hope we all made, and will keep, that is to rededicate ourselves to the purposes of the OOTFA, to do our best to promote and preserve the long standing art of fiddling and the Old -Time songs of yesteryear.

We are now into February and springtime can not be far off. This long-awaited change of seasons signals a host of activities that will shape the leadership and programs for the coming year in our district and state activities. The lineup consists of election of officers, our State Convention on April 6-7-8, our Oregon State Old Time Fiddlers contest in Salem on May 19-20. As a member in good standing you have the chance to participate in all of these activities. There are positions in the district and state levels that need members to step up to the challenges. One of the most important opportunities you have is to exercise your membership right to vote. When election time comes around, you have an input as to who will serve in positions of responsibility, leadership, and management. Your vote is important. At the state board meeting in Springfield January 7, the selection committee completed the process of selecting the names that will go on the Distinguished Service Award plaque. These will be announced at the convention in April. Also, the people selected for this honor will receive a certificate of appreciation for their

effort in promoting the purposes of the OOTFA.

At long last we finally have the budget completed for the fiscal year 2006-2007. This took a great deal of effort and thought by all involved, especially your secretary/treasurer. She went back and assembled the expenses and income over the last three years. Then she took an average of those amounts to decide each line item for the 2006-2007 budget. At the January board meeting your Vice President, Irene Ruddock and myself, along with your Secretary/Treasurer Sharon Gallagher, reviewed all of this and the job was finally completed. This is something I think we should have done long ago; I hope it will allow us to keep better track of our income and expenses and let our members be better informed as to the business of the organization. There will be copies of the budget available at the convention for those who would like one.

The date for treasurers to turn in their end of the year books should be changed from July 15 to August 1. In addition. ARTICLE X, Section 1 should be changed to read that these BY-LAWS may be amended by twothirds [2/3] majority vote of the members at any one of the two regular state meetings or any special meeting called for that purpose. We will vote on these proposed by-law changes at the convention. I was asked if an out of state member could vote. No, they may not. Check under Eligibility to vote. Section 5. Looking forward to seeing all of you at the convention.
