From the Editor Emeritus:

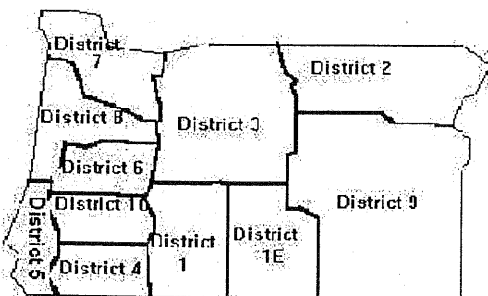

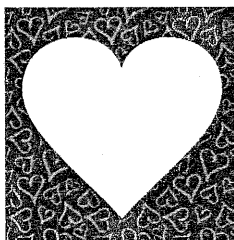
jam and interviewed folks, then recorded much of the session. It was scheduled to broadcast on their Jefferson Daily program, January 16.
