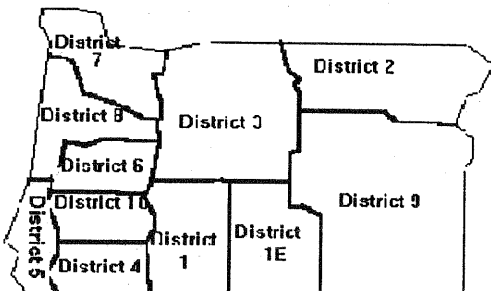
## From the Editor Emeritus:

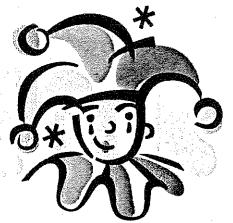
District members need to pay
