We voted on the two amendments that were stated in the Hoedowner. ARTICLE V MEETINGS Sec 1 line a. to be changed to read: "State and District Officers, because they are expected to attend all State Meetings will be reimbursed for mileage at the rate of thirty five cents (.35 cents) per mile. State to reimburse State Officers, and Districts to reimburse District Officers. The proposed language for Article V Section 1 f was: " Along with input from the Finance Committee (appointed by the President) prepare a budget annually for the next fiscal year and present to the Executive Board for their approval at the summer meeting". Both amendments were approved. Remember to get your nominations for the "Distinguished Service Award" in before we have the next quarterly meeting in January. to higher costs, the magnetic ones will be \$ 9.00 and the others will be \$ 8.00.


