Now we need your help. Amy and I need some feedback from you about the Junior Hoedowner page. What are your comments? What are your suggestions? Its purpose is to inform and involve young people as much as possible and to let the general membership know what young people are doing. We are investing in our future.

Some readers might call it bragging but I am going to call it "informing." A group of us gathered at Linda Easley's log cabin at Manzanita for "Stone Soup" and fiddling (and a walk on the beach). We were invited to play Friday evening at a nearby assisted living facility. Never in 27 years being a member of OOTFA have I listened to a group play together so well as a team. (No, I wasn't playing so I can brag.) The audience just a few feet away was involved singing along, clapping, laughing, showing their approval. Then the next day 16 members gathered at Pine Grove community building in Manzanita to play for 150 or more people. Again the spirit of being a team impressed me -- fiddlers from districts 7 and 8. While the musicians were introduced as individuals, nearly everyone asked the others to join in. Nobody was threatened; they all played together for the audience.
