Bob Savs: "Hello District members. As I reported to you at our September meeting, I did attend the State Board Meeting and the semiannual general business meeting as your representative at Merrill, Oregon on September 11-13

"There were several important pieces of business that came to the floor that required a vote of the members. At our October 5 meeting, I made that report to the members present, but since we now have 62 family members in District(3) three and only (16) sixteen members present at the meeting, it is obvious most of you were not there. One of the changes made was how the mileage paid to State and District officers was changed. It will now state: The mileage will be adjusted according to what the Federal Government does. When they adjust their mileage rate, we will also adjust our rate per mile and at the same rate per The present rate is 58 1/2 mile. cents. I didn't agree with some of this, but the members voted for it so we are stuck with it. Another change was concerning the State Fiddle Contest. It now says the contest will be held annually instead of April or May."

By the way, if you have moved or your e-mail was changed let us know, so we can make sure you get your Hoedowner and e-mails. If you have left a forwarding address at the post office, we have to pay extra postage to get your Hoedowners to you. It cost OOTFA well over \$100.00 a year to forward Hoedowners to people who haven't provided us with an address change. These changes I mentioned above, should be made to your present By-Laws, if you have some, that way yours will be up to date until the new ones are available.

Don't forget to pay your 2009 dues by December 1 so you will get your January Hoedowner. Pay them to Earlene Ervin she is District 3 Membership Chairperson, Well, that about does it for now. Hope to see some of you at our meetings sometime. Keep playing that old time music we all love so much."
