Greetings From your President

The State Convention is next. District 8 has done a remarkable job of planning for this year. There will be something for everyone. It is April 8-11, 2009. Be prepared for full bellies, sore fingers and great conversations. Please remember to bring a NICE item for our raffle.

The party starts on Wednesday compliments of Districts 7 and 8. And it will continue until the last player leaves on Saturday night. Plenty of RV parking is available. I hope to see all of you there.

If anyone is interested in being a State Officer, you can be nominated from the floor at our Annual meeting Saturday. Many people have inquired why I was not running for a second term. unfortunately have over-committed myself with my business and other volunteer activities and could not devote as much time to OOTFA as I would have wanted. It has been a pleasure serving as your President this past year and I look forward to working with whomever elect for next vear.

I have several phone calls from members across the state who have expressed concerns about many issues relating to OOTFA activities. I felt it was important to share with you my feelings on these subjects. These are NOT

official OOTFA rules, just my personal opinion. Hope you find them useful.

1. It is OK to use a music stand. Some of us are getting

older and can't remember the words or chords as well as we used to. There is NOTHING in the By-laws or standing rules that says we cannot use music stands, except in a contest.

- 2. The person who is the lead can pick the key, even if it is more difficult for back-up to play. They even get to pick the song even if it is one you do not like or have never heard before.
- 3. The person who is lead gets to set the speed and the tempo, even if it is off kilter or is a different version with different notes than what you are accustomed. Back-up should not try to impose their version of the song, even if it might be right. Back-up needs to listen to the person in lead and follow them.
- 4. It is OK for a singer to be off-key, a fiddler to miss notes or a guitar player to have their rhythm off or be playing too loud or soft. (Or even for a banjo to be out of tune!) We are at a jam and performance to have fun and enjoy each other's company. If we are at a paying gig, it is appropriate that we do play at our best, so don't be offended if you are not asked to play, as some people who hire us have specific requirements such as no vocals, number of players, etc.
- 5. Playing for an audience is NOT the main purpose of OOTFA. It is only when we have been contracted to play for a paying gig that we can require a higher level of musicianship.
- 6. Consideration and respect of everyone, no matter how good or bad that they may play or sing needs to be given. Everyone should be encouraged and told they did great. No one should ever be put down or made to feel bad about their performance. There is no such thing as a BAD performance! We need to remember we are all amateurs. If someone is brave enough to step up to a

Well, I'd be remiss if I didn't explain for newcomers to the camp out what the Hat Jam and Draw Band contests entail. The Hat Jam seems to get more animated every year. Each contestant picks a hat to match the song they're playing and they choose their back-up players to help out. Say, for example you're doing "over the waves," you might pick a pirate hat matey. Argghh! Walk the plank or I'll boil you in oil.

The Draw Band contest, alternately called the Can Band contest or Band Scramble begins with the contestants entering their name in various cans according to which instruments they can play. You don't have to be a virtuoso. but only be able to pick up a tune easily. To assemble the bands, Terry will pick out a name from each can, so there will be a singer, a fiddler, a guitar player, etc. to make up the band. Then, you give the band a name -the funnier the better. You have just a short time to come up with a couple of tunes you can throw together and perform onstage. It's a nerve wracking challenge, but great fun, and the audience just goes crazy! So, hope that explains the contests.
