From Your President

Hope you are enjoying summer, now that it has finally arrived.

At the Board meeting in Burns on June 19, several items were approved that will affect our membership. The first you may be holding in your hands or reading on-line. We now have a new Hoedowner design, publisher and printer. The Board appointed a committee, chaired by Joe Moyle, to investigate ways to reduce the cost of publishing the Hoedowner. The committee's proposal, which was accepted by the Board, will save OOTFA over \$6,000 annually. As part of this change, members may now request that they receive a PDF copy of the Hoedowner automatically e-mailed to them monthly, rather than having to go to a web site and download it. If you want to opt-in for this free service and receive your Hoedowner as an Email, please contact Mark Ratzlaff at <u>mark@octoberdesign.com</u> and let him know. This will also save OOTFA the cost of printing and mailing the Hoedowner to those who sign-up for this service. I strongly urge those who have a high-speed internet connection to sign-up. Please let Mark know by September 15, so we can be sure that you get your October Hoedowner.

The Board was concerned that many people are not paying dues because they can get the Hoedowner free on-line. The Board felt that we should remove the Hoedowner from our web site so that only members are able to access it. Starting with the October issue, it is planned that only information about calendars and events such as meetings, convention, campouts and contest will be accessible to the general public. This will be discussed further at the September biannual meeting in Merrill on September 18. My further recommendation is that we still provide the full Hoedowner in a format that is readable on-line, for those who have a slow dial-up connection and want to get Hoedowner on-line, rather than via mail or Email. I plan to create a web site that will require that the user enter a membership password to gain access. The password will be provided, upon request to Mark Ratzlaff, to members who have paid their dues.

I am also pleased to announce that our Distinguished Service Award has been re-named in honor of Norm Nash, as the Oregon Old Time Fiddler's Association Norm Nash Distinguished Service Award.

My appreciation to all of the Oregon fiddlers who entered at the National Fiddle Contest in Weiser! Andy Emert is the 2010 Adult Champion, Rolland White won the Certified contest as the Best Male Entertertainer and Tatiana Hargreaves for Best Costume. Isacc Calendar took 3rd place in the Young Adult Division, Miya Saito-Beckman took 5th place in the Junior Division and Gayle Clarity took 4th place in the Senior-Senior division. Congratulations to all of you.

This month is the Winchester Bay Fiddle on the Beach campout from August 19-22 at the Winchester Bay Community Center. More information can be found at: <u>www.fiddleonthebeach.</u> <u>info</u> Hope to see many of you there.

Also, don't forget the OOTFA Fiddle Camp from August 11-14, 2010 at 1000 Trails in Bend. Bob Ervin has a fine group of instructors lined up this year. 
