From Your President

I was asked recently what is "Old Time" music? From my perspective, old-time music is a type of North American folk music, with roots in the folk music of many countries, including England Scotland, Ireland and countries in Africa. It developed along with various North American folk dances, such as square dance, buck dance, and clogging. The genre also includes ballads and other types of folk songs. It is played on acoustic instruments, generally centering on a combination of fiddle and plucked string instruments (most often the guitar and banjo(!)) Historian Richard Nevins says "It is likely all countless variations of country fiddling in North America can be traced to seven or eight different styles brought over by Celtic immigrants from Northern Ireland, southern Scotland and parts of England."

Songs of British origin included; Soldiers Joy, Irish Washerwomen and Molly Put the Kettle On. American tunes included, Flop-eared Mule, Cumberland Gap and Cripple Creek. Also included are Black influenced fiddle airs like Cotton-Eyed Joe, and Old Zip Coon better known today as Turkey in the Straw. But old-time tunes can come from unlikely sources. The old time waltz, Over The Waves, was originally written by Mexican composer, Juventino Rosa as Sobre las Ola!. Old-time fiddling is a style of playing of the fiddle that includes slides, double stops, shuffles and double shuffles. There are many distinct styles of old-time fiddling based on geography. I am sure that many of you have other definitions you would like to share.

Please plan on joining us for our Quarterly Board meeting, potluck and jam session to be held at Emerald Park, at 1400 Lake Drive in Eugene, on January 15th at 10:00pm. Jam session and potluck will follow. See you all there.

From the Editor Emeritus

I received this letter several years ago and was given permission to use it so I thought I would share it with you this month. It goes beyond just playing a tune - but how fiddle music touches our hearts and affects our lives. I think this letter expresses it so well.

Hi Lew, my name is Jennifer Polk.

I've been receiving your emails & newsletters for quite some time as I have been a member of OOFTA. I'm writing to let you that my Dad, Jim Wilson, who has been an OOFTA member since before I was born in 1969, passed away on May 27, 2007. I've been meaning to write you for some time now. It has been kind of hard adjusting to my Dad being gone. He has been such an inspiration to me. I have grown up listening to his fiddle music, the music was a normal part of my home life and I loved it. A couple years ago I took fiddle lessons from Amy Booher and I told her about my Dad and how he inspired me to want to play. I enjoyed my lessons so much and to Amy's gleeful surprise, I knew most of the tunes already because I had heard my Dad play them.

At that time he gave me a fiddle that he brought back from Austria during WWII; he found it in a house that had been partially blown up --- it's beautiful. After he passed we found plans for making a fiddle and a partially made one that he hadn't finished. I am currently not taking lessons but I am continuing to learn new tunes and I get to play with my sister, Cindy Jo Norenburg, (also an OOFTA member) occasionally and she inspires me also. She as well grew up listening to our Dad's fiddle music. We played some tunes that were my Dad's favorite at his services. I believe my Dad was originally a member of district 4 or 5, southwestern Douglas county. He then may have changed to district 8 when we moved to Marion county. Jim Wilson was a wonderful fiddle player, inspiration, and most of all a wonderful Dad and I just wanted to let you know this.

His mother gives much credit for his success and his brother's and sister's success because of their early involvement with the OOTFA. Rudi, Meriwyn and Justin have all been Oregon State Champion fiddlers and are thankful for the help, the experience, the many tunes and friends they have received from OOTFA.

I can remember visiting with maybe eight and ten year old Chris and Rudi Booher at the state convention at the Douglas County Fairgrounds at Roseburg back in the 1980s. I would ask them, "Where's your mother." And they would answer, "Oh, she's home with the babies." In a recent letter I asked their mother, Dolores, to write about the "babies."

Chris, 40 (Drain, OR) 6 children, ages 2-17, all singing and playing fiddles, piano, ukulele, cello, etc. Chris earned two Grammies for his piano work with Asleep at the Wheel. When Chris married Lisa, we had the privilege of welcoming her beautiful little 6-yr-old daughter, Ericka, into our family. Chris adopted her, so she's a real Booher, and wonderful help to her mom with all the little ones. She has graduated from high school almost a year ago, and works for Rudi at his Main Street Espresso in Yoncalla. Chris and Lisa and family are new members of OOTFA as of the Saturday Dist. 10 jam. Chris' only son, Kenneth, loves to fiddle and sing. His little sisters are following suit! Chris works with them on their harmony parts. Lisa is a born and bred Texan, with generations of Texans in her lineage, so if you hear her say "Y'all" or that she's "fixin'" to do something, you'll know why!

Rudi, 39 (Nov. 15) (Yoncalla, OR), 6 children, ages 1-12, all singing and playing fiddles, guitar, ukulele, piano, cello. Ned, 37 (Redmond, OR) 2 children, James & Lorelei. 14-yr-old Lorelei plays piano and penny whistle and sings wonderfully well. Ned is on the "worship team" in a small church in Redmond. He plays guitar and is their lead singer. He and Lorelei sing together a lot.

Justin, 36 (Kennewick, WA) He and Desiree adopted 2 little girls in 2009 (not siblings). The oldest one, Roanna (she'll be two in Feb.), can sing the notes to Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star and Jesus Loves Me perfectly in tune (she's not talking much yet). Ellen just turned one year old. Justin teaches fiddle, guitar, mandolin, piano, cello and voice in his backyard studio. A couple of years ago he was National Adult Fiddle Champion, and also won the NW Open Championship. 
