

This will be a busy two months for OOTFA. On March 18-19 is our state contest at Chemeketa College in Salem. Lew Holt has more information about the contest in his column.

On April 6-9, 2011 we will have our annual convention and annual meeting at the Polk County Fairgrounds in Rickreall, OR. Lew Holt and Fred Hardin are planning for another great show on Friday April 8. We ask all Districts to help at the convention. District assignments this year are: Districts 1&6 – set up tables for Sat. night banquet; 1E&9 – front desk; 3&4 – raffle; 5&7 – overnight camping (\$15 per night Tuesday and Sunday; \$12.50 Wednesday through Saturday); 7&8 – chairs, advertising, banquet. On April 6, District 8 will be our host at the Arts and Craft Building. Doors will open at 9 a.m. for the early arrivals. We will have jamming, visiting, finger foods, snacks and coffee all day compliments of District 8. Contributions will be received at the door. Please help me in advance for THANKING District 8 for a job well done! If you have questions, special needs or any other help please contact Phil Ringle or any other District 8 officers.

We also need lots of help setting up the stage on Thursday morning and stacking all of the chairs and tables and cleaning the facility on Saturday night after the dance. If everyone pitches in it will be much easier!

Each district is asked to bring 2 or 3 floral arrangements for our Saturday night banquet tables. Each district and all members of OOTFA are urged to bring high quality, excellent condition, handcrafts, quilts, instruments, or other items that you would be proud to take home yourself, for the annual raffle.

We ask that you make reservations and pre-pay for the banquet on Saturday night. It will once again be catered by the Dallas High School cooking program. The choice is tri-tip beef or chicken and includes vegetables, bread and dessert. OOTFA will provide a beverage (coffee, tea or water). Price is \$13 per person. Please send your choices and your check to Sharon Gallagher so she receives it no later than April 1 at 2030 King Lane, Myrtle Point, OR 97458. There will be a very limited number of extra banquet tickets available at the convention, so please pre-order now so you will not be disappointed.

Fiddle Tips: Overcoming the Jitter Bugs, by Beverly Conrad

Your mouth goes dry, your knees shake, if you tried to tap your foot you would fall over, your hands sweat so badly that you think you would be better off wearing gloves, and worst of all -- your bow bounces and bounces and bounces and the lovely waltz you are trying to play sounds more like a jitter bug.

Stage fright: I hate when that happens. Even seasoned musicians are prone to an occasional bout of the jitters when performing. New fiddlers who may play very nicely by themselves, or in front of a few close friends can become terribly scared when performing in front of a live audience -- no matter how friendly the people are.

Here are some tips that may help you overcome stage fright. It is the excess energy that comes with nervousness and that rush of adrenaline that caused the hands to shake. Although this shaking may not be too evident at your fingertips, when magnified at the end of a long stick -- the bow -- it becomes very noticeable. What was a fine flutter becomes an incredible bounce.

Warm up exercises help alleviate this problem. Jeffery Judd of Williamsport, Pennsylvania, says that eight or ten long strokes of the bow on double strings will help to relieve the bow arm of excess tension and energy. Play GD and DA then AE. Move the bow solidly from tip to frog and back again.

I'm a firm believer in the 25 Rule. Make yourself perform twenty-five times in front of an audience. Seek out open jams or open mikes, offer to get our fiddle out and play a couple of tunes at a family reunion, church picnic, school or senior center. Keep count. The more you make yourself do this, the easier it will become until one day you will get up to perform and notice that, for a change -- your knees aren't shaking. That's a wonderful feeling.


Play something you know well. This worked for me. Until I was able to get up on stage one day and NOT feel my knees shake and bow bounce, I played the same two songs when soloing or and didn't stray off the path of notes that I had practiced. If you practice performing by playing songs that you know inside out and backwards, at least you will be comfortable with what you are playing. It is familiar. This is similar to driving on roads you know well and being on roads you have never traveled down before. Let the driving get tricky with snow, rain, wind, or fog and it's a whole lot easier to be on a familiar road. Stay on the familiar road while you work out the kinds of stage fight.

Pay attention to your audience. Some people believe that in order to overcome stage fright it is best to block out the audience, find a point on a back wall and concentrate on it. I don't. There is something in human nature that gives us a good feeling when we give to another human being. Music gives. Give them the tune as you play it, forget the jitters, and enjoy the good feeling that comes with giving.


