Actually this is a good thing to practice anytime you attend any performance. Many venues have separate areas where you can talk and visit without interfering with those who want to listen to the performance.

Put January 21, 2012 on your calendar for our quarterly board meeting potluck and jam at Emerald Park in Eugene. I will have more information next month.

Happy Holidays to you and your families! This has been a remarkable year for OOTFA and we all have much to celebrate.

## **Mira Cross**



My name is Mira Cross and I'd like to tell you a little about myself. I am 10-years-old, and I live in Lyons. I was inspired to play the fiddle in Kindergarten when my teacher's son, Robbie Griswold (an OOTFA champion fiddler), came to play for our class. I knew then that I wanted to play the fiddle. His mom, Cathy, could tell that school was proving to be very easy for me, so she encouraged me to take up fiddle as a way to keep me challenged.

I started playing in first grade, taking lessons with Ginny Hollan. I learned how to play many fiddle tunes by ear during my time with Ginny. My first fiddle tune was "Boil 'em Cabbage" and I learned two

different variations of that song. Eventually I progressed to more difficult tunes like "Devil's Dream," "Stinky's Blues," and "Whiskey Before Breakfast." I learned these songs-and several others-without reading the music. It was Ginny who encouraged me to join the Oregon Old Time Fiddlers and I have been on scholarship with District 8 OOTFA since 2009.

After Ginny moved to Bend, I started lessons with Kelly Leggett in Aumsville. With Kelly I have learned more about music theory and how to sight read music. I can pretty much play anything if I have the music for it. I work on Irish fiddle tunes, American fiddle tunes, and classical music. I also have enjoyed playing John William's music from movies such as Star Wars and Harry Potter.

In September I began playing with the Salem Youth Symphony. I rehearse with them once a week and am learning how to play with the dynamics of a symphony. This is a fun way to learn more about how to play my instrument. Hearing the violins, violas, and cellos all play together is a wonderful sound! My 7-year-old sister Aubrie plays the piano and it is fun to play songs with her too. In addition to playing the fiddle, I play volleyball each Fall and Spring, so I stay very busy all year round!

I have played on stage with the OOTFA in many different places such as the McMinnville Harvest Festival, the Aumsville Park, the Oregon State Fair, and various Senior Centers. I used to be very nervous to play in front of a crowd, but everyone in the OOTFA makes me feel welcome and now I really enjoy getting up on stage and playing with the other members. They inspire me to keep playing the fiddle and even though I'm still young, I am proud to be an Old Time Fiddler!

## Fiddle Tips, by Eileen Walter

Practicing exercises on the fiddle is somewhat similar to exercising for the health of one's body – not always fun – but way more fun once results are noticed – right? I'd like to share some of my favorite exercises from time to time in this column.

Here's an exercise to help improve intonation. Playing in tune is especially challenging for us as our fiddles don't have frets indicating where to place our fingers. There are many variations of this exercise, but here's a basic version that includes the finger positions that occur in many common fiddle tunes. I've included "high" and "low" second finger positions as I find that placing the second finger high enough or low enough is a common intonation issue among fiddlers.

Start with the G string. Play the open string, then the first finger in the "normal" position, then the open string again, then the second finger in a "low" position, then the open string again, then the second finger in a "high" position, then the open string again, then the third finger in the "normal" position, the open string again, the fourth finger in the "normal" position, and end with the open string. Do the same thing with the D string, A string, and E string. When you check in with the open string after each note, your fingers will be less likely to gradually become sharp or flat.

Here's the finger pattern: 0 1 0 Low 2 0 High 2 0 3 0 4 0

Here are the names of the notes if you want to check your intonation with a chromatic tuner as you go:GAGBbGBGCGDGDEDFDF#DGDADABACAC#ADAEAEF#EGEG#EAEBE

You can also do this exercise in ½ step intervals (chromatically) and cover all possible finger positions. I hope you give this a try and find it useful – and please be sure and let me know if you do.

Featured musicians at the November jam were Julie Turner and Dawn Vonderlin, both from Bandon. Dawn grew up in a musical family that sang and played together, especially at Christmas. In school she played trumpet and flute and got her first fiddle as a high school graduation present but never took it seriously until recently when she moved to Bandon, started playing with friends and read in the newspaper that OOTFA was sponsoring fiddle lessons. She started taking lessons from Bob Shaffar and realized that fiddling was really for her until she is old and grey and rocking on her porch.

Julie Turner was unhappily enrolled in ballet at an early age but was finally allowed to quit and take piano lessons. Because she realized she was the type of musician who was advised to "keep your day job" she directed her energies to other interests, eventually getting a PhD in mechanical engineering. She was employed variously as a structural engineer, college professor, flight instructor and aircraft systems engineer while raising three children who were not forced to take ballet lessons! She retired to Bandon with her husband and also found OOTFA's fiddle classes and started fiddling around and loving it.

Larry Costa, the featured performer at the Brookings jam, started singing in church choirs while in elementary school, glee club in high school and college and then in an Army group called the "Bayonet Chorale" in Korea. After listening to The Weavers in 1962 he got his first banjo and taught himself to play from Pete Seeger's instruction book. While in seminary studying for the priesthood for eight years, he used folk music in his ministry, and then decided the ministry was not for him; he was drafted into the army and sent to Korea where he spent his tour with a folk trio called "The "Talismen". After leaving the army he married and had a family and didn't play again for 40 years until moving to Arizona. Then he moved to Powers, went to a jam in Bandon and had his arm twisted into joining OOTFA. He puts a lot of fun into his music without any banjo jokes!

If you haven't paid your dues for next year get it done! Your name won't be in the new roster for next year if you delay.

By the time you are reading this the combined Thanksgiving-Christmas holiday dinner will be over and we will all be stuffed and weigh five pounds more. Ruth Weyer will be cooking the turkey and Mapril Combs the ham and the rest of us will be bringing the accompaniments. We have a bunch of great cooks!


