It turns out the inspector was looking for a nasty invasive species, the Quagga mussel, on boats coming north out of California and west, out of Idaho. Boats moving east from western Oregon were not being checked because there is insufficient mineral content in the water for mussels to create shells, and they cannot survive. The mussels are small, reproduce rapidly and in large numbers, block water inlets and piping, threaten the survival of other species, and are a significant ecological threat.

### Fiddle Tips by Eileen Walter - Slides - Part 1

Slides are an integral part of playing the fiddle. Slides can embellish notes, they can be a necessary part of a tune, and they are used to make proper intonation easier to attain.

A fiddler must learn to keep a light touch with the left hand, as a tight grip will make it more difficult to slide a finger. If you feel that you're gripping the fingerboard too tightly, experiment with how little pressure you can exert and still get the proper sound – you may be surprised!

Slides can be long or short, depending on the style or the tune. One can slide into a note from a lower pitch, one can slide into a note from a higher pitch (although this is not common), and one can slide out of a note (usually to a lower pitch). One can slide into and out of the same note – I call this "bending" the note. I use at least small slides in every tune I play. I make use of longer slides in many rags – (such as Texas Crapshooter Rag, Rat Cheese Rag, Maynard's Rag, Beaumont Rag, and Lone Star Rag). Many tunes incorporate a slide along with a shift to a higher position. Many waltzes - (such as Morning Star Waltz, Kelly's Waltz, and Wednesday Night Waltz) have slides along with double stops. Occasionally after playing a single note, another note is added to form a double stop. The double stop has a better chance of sounding in tune if the fiddler begins the added note slightly flat and moves it up until it sounds in tune with the existing note. This may require moving other fingers out of the way.

Practice sliding into notes while playing scales. Of course, this will require moving fingers out of the way. There is much to say about slides, and I've run out of room for this column, so I'll continue in my next column. I hope everyone has a great summer filled with music.

### Tune of the Month – Using Slides: The Rat Cheese Rag

Eileen Walter sent along this improbably named tune, about which she says, "....it does have slides in the last line. It slides up to third position in the first measure of the last line and slides back down to first position at the end of the second measure."


