What do you enjoy about playing fiddle? I enjoy the sound when I'm playing and being able to figure out a tune. I also enjoy learning to make my fiddle say funny things like, "Mooooo."

What is hardest about playing fiddle? Practicing.

Why did you prefer to take fiddle lessons rather than classical violin lessons? Because you get to play fast fiddle tunes that have a fun rhythm.

What do you appreciate most about your teacher? She's nice, she's calm, she's a great teacher and encourages me to work hard to get better at playing my fiddle.

Do you enjoy playing at jams? Yes, because I get to meet other fiddle players and I get to play with my dad as backup. I love performing.

Favorite songs to play: Boil the Cabbage, Angeline the Baker, Pig Ankle Rag and I'm learning Aaron Boat Waltz and know it will be a favorite too. Naomi's other interests include fairies, animals of all kinds and most recently birds. She participates in a local scouting troop with American Heritage Girls and also takes a voice class at the Community Music Center.

Our family enjoys listening to and creating music of all genres. Papa, Dennis, loves to create electronic music, but also plays mandolin and acoustic guitar. Fiddle Tips by Eileen Walter - Record Yourself

One of the best things you can do to improve your fiddling is to record yourself. It's difficult to listen to ourselves accurately while we are in the process of playing the fiddle and we can hear things more accurately if we listen to a recording. Some people are pleasantly surprised to hear how good they sound, but most of us are very critical of ourselves. If you're recording yourself for the first time, start with tunes that you play fairly well and work on those first; then progress to those tunes that you haven't worked on as much. The best thing to do is to pick out the things that you like about your sound and feel good about those, and then pick out those things you'd like to improve. As you listen to yourself, there are many things to consider – some of these are:

Are you playing in tune, or do you need to do some work with the tuner? Do you tend to play too sharp or too flat?

Are your fingers and bow strokes coordinated, or is there some "echo" or "fuzz"?

Can you hear all the notes, or are there some "ghost" notes that are not fully present?

Is your tone clear – are there any "scrunchy" or "airy" sounds? – If so, this may indicate issues with the angle of the bow or with incorrect amount of arm weight on the bow.

How is your rhythm – Are you in the "groove" - can you tap your foot or dance?

Are you playing with expression and dynamics – especially on a slow tune?

Is it too plain – do you need to add some ornamentation such as slides, grace notes, vibrato, double stops, etc. to make it more interesting? Or is it too busy and should you take some out?


Is it too choppy (maybe some slurs are needed, or longer bow strokes) or too smooth (maybe you have too many slurs -- too many slurs can make the beat difficult to detect) – Are your notes flowing and leading into the next notes, with the beat still evident?

Are you accomplishing the sound you want? How is the overall feel?

Are you in control of the tune – "Do you own it" - or is it getting away from you?

Tune of the Month - Sugar in the Gourd March

This tune is called a "march" to distinguish it from other tunes with the same name. It is in the key of "F", which makes many fiddlers uncomfortable. Can you transpose it to "D"? Hint: start at f# on the "d" string.
