I look forward to receiving the reports of these committees at the winter quarterly meeting in Sutherlin, and to a frank discussion of the issues involved.

### From the Editor Emeritus =

I am going to take a different turn this month and head down a different path. Each month I read and enjoy Rosin Dust from the Blue Mountain Old Time Fiddler's Association – it's on our web, too. Their president, Denny Langford writes a column for their newsletter. Last month he wrote some thoughts that caught my attention so I wrote to Denny – a good friend – to ask him if I might borrow his thoughts. He wrote back giving me the privilege to do as I pleased.

Denny wrote: "How often do we compliment each other or especially a new fiddler or even a new member of our organization? I hope we do not criticize and find fault with other's playing or singing abilities. When I first started playing I was told I was not playing the tunes right and I became shy. The old saying "you are not playing that right" would haunt me at every show. Later a friend told me that when I was at the mike to play MY tune. You play it your way and don't listen to anyone. Another friend said 'We are not professionals, we play for enjoyment and have fun, and hope that we have touched someone.' If people keep telling you how bad you are you will

lose confidence in yourself and quit. If people complement you and tell you that you did a good job, you want to continue and you get better every time you play. We need to encourage others. Let's all work on being nice and complementing others."

Thanks, Denny. Because of you and others, you have a very positive organization that shares your music with many across the northeast part of our state. It is true, also, of OOTFA and the rest of Oregon. Two wonderful associations that bring fiddle music to many people and allow many people opportunities to play.

Not many of you remember the campouts at Vernonia – a wonderful time in the history of OOTFA. I think of the time that as a new member back in the early 1980s that Alice showed Bill Yohey her newly acquired fiddle. I remember to this day Bill saying, "You never tell a lady she has an ugly baby." That impressed me. I try to live by that statement in all aspects of fiddles, fiddling and friends.

# Fiddle Tips, by Eileen Walter

I was recently reminded that sometimes fiddlers experience frustration with fingers that want to move together as a group rather than independently. My students who have had this issue have been able to work through it and train their fingers to move separately by doing the following exercise:

Play each note with a separate bow stroke, in other words – no slurs:


Play the following finger patterns on any (or all) strings:

01010101	12121212
23232323	3 4 3 4 3 4 3 4
02020202	03030303
0 4 0 4 0 4 0 4	13131313
14141414	24242424

Turn on your metronome and try this at different speeds – gradually increasing the tempo as it becomes more comfortable. Even if you don't have finger independence issues, this is still a good exercise – I highly recommend it.
