

The new venue in Bandon is at a private assisted living facility; as she receives the information needed concerning location, etc, our president will pass it on.



## Fiddle Tips, by Eileen Walter -- Endings

There are many ways to end tunes; I will only mention a few. While sometimes it's appropriate to end a tune by holding the last note for several beats, it often works well to have a more definite ending.

A final double stop (chord) in whatever key your tune is in is a simple and effective way to end a tune. A double stop ending on a fast tune is often played on the last 2 beats of the last measure, with a one beat rest preceding it. In other words, when you play the last note of a tune, which is often the first note of the last measure, play it for one beat, then take a one beat rest, during which time you can reposition your bow so you have the whole use of a down bow, and then play a final chord for 2 beats (sometimes you will hold the final chord out for more than 2 beats).

A waltz may have a three beat arpeggio starting at the second to last measure of the tune (this may be three triplets, three one beat notes, six one-half beat notes, etc.), with a three beat note or chord at the end of the arpeggio (the last measure of the tune). Example: Key of C arpeggio: G3 D1 D3 D1 and A Low2

Some waltzes may lend themselves to repeating a few measures as a tag, or have other types of endings. Here's an example in the Key of F: play a Low D2 for one beat and then hold it down while playing an open G for one beat, a Low G1 for one beat, and then a regular G1 for 3 beats

Tags are sometimes used at the end of fast tunes: Here are some examples in the Key of A:Fingers 3230120320120Fingers 30010 rest 23 (I'm sure you'll all recognize the rhythm of this one)E String------E String------

Here's a bluegrass ending: Fingers 0 1 Low2 High2 0 1 0 3 Strings A----- E------


The first note is 1 beat, the middle notes are  $\frac{1}{2}$  beat and the last note is 4 beats Some polkas end with 3 fast notes.

You may want to end a swing tune or a rag with a 6 chord, which you can form by choosing any of your 1,3,or 5 chord notes (from whichever key you're in), and then add the 6th note of the scale. Here are some examples:

Key of F - play an A (G1) & a D (open) A – play a C# (A2) & an F # (E1) Key of G – play a D (A3) & an E (D1) Key of C – play an E (D1) & an A (open) Key of

### Tune of the Month -- Soldier's Return

This tune, a reel from the Scottish and English music traditions, sounds really good when droned on a cross-tuned fiddle. The cross tuning used in District 6 is GDGD. To get it, leave the G and D strings as they are, but tune the A and E strings down one note.
