# Fiddle Tips by Eileen Walter

Happy Summer Everyone! I recently had the pleasure of teaching the advanced fiddle class at the West Cascades Camp. I thoroughly enjoyed the experience and my class was delightful.

At the beginning of the class, after we'd all introduced ourselves, I passed around a quiz – the type of quiz everyone likes – the type with no correct (or wrong) answers and the type where you don't have to sign your name. The purpose was to get everyone thinking about those things that I was going to discuss next.

Here's the quiz – I hope you take a few minutes to take the quiz yourself and that it provides some good food for thought about how you view your fiddling and how you might want to improve it.

While all of the following are important, please do the best you can to rank them in order of importance, 1 being the most important and 5 being the least:

\_\_\_\_\_ Tone & clarity – no squeaks, fuzz, ghost notes, tripping fingers, etc.

\_\_\_\_\_ Tempo (speed)

\_\_\_\_\_\_Use of ornamentation to enhance notes – slides, grace notes, etc.

\_\_\_\_\_ Proper rhythm – being in the "groove"

\_\_\_\_\_ Intonation – playing in tune

The big news for District 6 this month is the completion of another successful Fiddle Camp! By all reports, it was bigger and better than ever this year. We had 158 attending camp, including a record 50 youths, ages 6-18! The attendance has continued to increase over the four years of fiddle camp, with a total of 120 attending in 2013. Our Monday night show featuring the teaching staff brought in an audience of over 250 people, and at our Wednesday night dance, we counted 25 couples out dancing on the floor! It turns out that fiddle camp is a great way to recruit new members, as 18 new families joined OOTFA during the camp. One new member lives in Washington; he joined for the remainder of this year and paid up for next year as well! A big welcome to all our new OOTFA members!

The Kielhorn Foundation grant of \$2500 was used in its entirety as scholarships for the youth who attended camp. The Fiddle Camp Committee has already started planning for next year's camp, and one of the issues the committee will discuss will be reconfiguring the scholarship offerings so that we can avoid dipping into operating funds.

We were requested by participants of last year's camp to do three things: build a cell tower nearby, eliminate the mosquitoes, and cool down the temperature. Well... we were able to accomplish the final request. We had a much cooler camp this year, a relief from the extreme heat of previous years, with a wild thunder and lightning storm spicing things up on Tuesday night. Some of our tent campers even had to come inside and sleep in classrooms! We thank all those who attended for making it a HUGE success. We also want to thank Ray's Market in Oakridge for providing coffee, ice, and snacks every day for the campers!

We had a good turnout at the Mary Cole Days celebration. Perhaps ten people rode the float, and 15 or so played at the jam in the fire hall, using Hal Weiner's new Bose sound system.

The annual Spencer Creek Grange pancake breakfast was, as usual, a success. It was highlighted by the appearance of Tenaya Cooley, and her dad, Bruce. Noticeably taller than she was when last we saw her, the Willamette Valley Fiddle Contest winner (runner-up in the Junior Junior category) whipped off the "Beaumont Rag," and several other numbers, to the delight of listeners.

Our beginning and intermediate group fiddle classes will start up again in September and will continue once every month through the school year. These classes are a fun way to improve skills and learn new tunes! The first intermediate class of the season will take place September 6 at 2-4 p.m. in the River Road Annex (1055 River Road, Eugene). The basic fiddle class is scheduled for September 8 at 1 p.m. in the Bethesda Lutheran Church (4445 Royal in Eugene).
