#### From the Editor Emeritus =

We enjoy OOTFA because of the folks that gave us our start 50 years ago. Cliff Buker stands out as being the one who got the ball rolling. He was born in American Forks, Utah. He died in Newport, Oregon on January 18, 1982 at the age of 88. Mr. Buker and his parents came across the Oregon Trail in 1904 in a covered wagon from Utah to Oregon and settled in the Waldport area where he resided until his death.

Cliff started playing the fiddle when he was 12 years old. Cliff stepped on a piece of glass out on the flatlands in Waldport and sliced an artery in his foot. He needed something to keep from getting bored while he was confined to his room while his foot healed. His dad brought him his old violin and Cliff taught himself to play. Before he was injured, Cliff had not been allowed to touch the instrument. "In 1963 I fiddled for the first time in my life at the Benton County Fair in Corvallis. They enticed me up there with a ham, told me if I came they would give me one. I fooled them and won all the honors," he continued. "It was then I got interested in fiddling which is a different technique than simply playing the violin.

"In 1964 there was no fiddlers ssociation in Oregon but several of the other states had one. I helped start the Oregon Fiddlers Association with 13 members each paying a dollar for membership. It has grown now to over 500 members," Buker said.

One of the greater honors to befall Cliff was his winning in both 1965 and 1967 at the National Old Time Fiddlers Contest held in Idaho. "You have to be over 65 to win that," Cliff said.

"I used to play the violin at those Saturday night dances. Had to play all kinds of things, square dances, schottisches and polkas. But, when I wasn't playing for dances I would perform at the theater. I played the accompaniment for the silent films. I think I liked 'Covered Wagon' and 'The Hunchback of Notre Dame' best," the fiddler remembered. He also became quite proficient at mending and patching nets for the fishermen. He still knits crab nets for something to do in the winter. (1974)

"There isn't anything I would have rather done with my life," he explained. "I just keep fiddling and by the way my violin is at least 200 years old." With that, he picked up his bow and played a duet with his wife at the piano.

I first heard Cliff play about 1979 at the Cranberry Festival in Bandon.

# Fiddle Tips, by Eileen Walter - About Fiddle Contests, Part 2



Preparing Your Contest Tunes and Rounds

For the regular divisions of the Oregon State Contest, you'll need two rounds of three tunes each, plus one extra hoedown for use as a tie-breaker. Small fry contestants will need only one round of three tunes plus one extra tie-breaker hoedown. Unless you're very experienced and are comfortable playing many tunes well, you'll be more comfortable if you prepare months ahead of time.

It's best not to play "newer" tunes, but those that you've been playing for awhile and are totally comfortable with. You'll want to play tunes that have all the "bugs" worked out, that you can play cleanly (no fuzzy notes or ghost notes that aren't totally there), with good tone, good intonation, and in the rhythmic "groove". Put

your own personality into it, and "own" the tune. Don't play anything that will sound as though you are struggling, as the "effort" will detract from the musicality.

Each round consists of a hoedown, a waltz, and a tune of choice that's not a hoedown or waltz (see last month's column). Some tunes may be "ambiguous" and may fit into either the hoedown or tune of choice category depending on how the tune is played. Practice your tunes in order with a brief pause between them and make sure they fit within the four minute time limit. If they don't, you'll need to make some changes. If you need any advice about such things as tune categories, or how to make a round fit into four minutes, you're more than welcome to contact me at gdaewalt@comcast.net

Practice with a metronome, spot check your notes with a tuner, record yourself, isolate problem areas and practice them slowly, play with a good accompanist if possible, and practice getting off to a good start. Be confident that you've already worked out all the technical details and you no longer need to think about them while you're playing your tunes – I think we all know that doubts in the brain translate into fumbling fingers.

Don't think too much about judges and/or scores – just about enjoying the tunes and being glad that you are able to put on a good performance. There may be some fiddlers who score higher than you, but that doesn't mean you aren't a fantastic fiddler.

I'll end this month's column with some very good advice I heard once about visualizing. When you're practicing for a performance, pretend you're actually performing. Visualize the stage, the audience, the microphone, etc. Then when you're actually performing, pretend you're actually enjoying playing comfortably in your home.
