### From the Editor Emeritus

Music can both make us sad and help us deal with our sadness. The tune, "Will the Circle be Unbroken" probably touches me most as I remember my mother who loved fiddling so much. Her father was an old time fiddler in Kansas many years ago. It was his fiddle that I inherited, starting me on the journey that brings me here today.

In 1990, Alice and I were asked to play "One Day at a Time" at Barbara McLeod's funeral. Barbara was the widow of Les who had been one our most respected fiddlers in the area and a grand fellow. It was to have been a graveside service on the edge of the sand dunes, a mile or so from the ocean near Bandon. When we arrived at the graveyard, it started to rain, so the services were changed to a little nearby country church.

At the little country church, Alice and I were asked to play both before the service and during the service. Alice and I looked at each other. We weren't prepared to play "funeral tunes" so I announced that Barbara was always with Les at our jams so we would play Les's tunes. We played lively tunes like "Red Wing", "Just Because", "Snow Deer", "I'll be all Smiles Tonight", "Golden Slippers", etc. As we played, tears flowed freely from Les and Barbara's many friends. After the service, they told us how much they'd enjoyed our choice of tunes and how the fiddle music had made them feel both sadness and joy. The music had brought back some sadness as they remembered the "old times" with Les and Barbara, but it brought many happy memories with it too. Their tears came both from sadness at their loss and from joy at having enjoyed the music together for many years.

Each of us experiences fiddle music in our own way. I may lack the skills of a good player but if my simple little tunes bring happiness to others, then I am happy.

## Fiddle Tips: by 00TFA President and Oregon State Fiddle Champion 2017... Jim Kuether

Have you ever noticed when learning a new tune, that there is a big difference in playing it to your self vs performing it on stage or before the public the first time? Or for that matter, just playing along with back up? My propensity is to want to listen to the back up and forgetting the tune when played for the first or second time. So I make it a habit of trying it out in front of an audience with all its distractions before playing on stage. My favorite way is to play it before a shut-in audience first. They don't mind a mistake or two for the most part! Of course the more experience you get playing in front of an audience the more confidence you will have with your playing skills and the better the delivery. You will know you have the piece down when your muscle memory takes over and your fingers do the walking!!
