There is one faucet in the park next door, but to use it requires at least a 100 foot hose and is very inconvenient, assuming the water is turned on. Thanks to the many fine musicians who did District 6 proud at the State Fiddle Contest at Chemeketa Community College on St. Patrick's Day. Hours of practice, polishing and mental preparation underlie each performance. Maybe some of you performers will represent us at the National Fiddle Contest in Weiser, as well. Evelyn Horner, Jerry Parks and Donna Wynn competed in Senior Divisions and Zaylon Cole played in the Junior-junior category. Thanks, too, to the back-up musicians who stood ready to support the fiddlers and to the volunteers who contributed to the smooth operation of this large-scale event.

We are fortunate to have a few wonderful old grange halls that allow us to host our regular jams. Granges were created to support local farmers and to provide social hubs in rural areas, sponsoring dances, picnics, fairs, plays and music recitals. Historically, they have filled vital roles in each community. The three granges we have standing arrangements with for monthly jams include Elmira, Central and Willakenzie.

Willakenzie Grange, built in 1913, was included in the National Registry of Historic Places in 2009. Its farmers spawned the Producers Public Market in 1915, now known familiarly and fondly as Lane County Farmer's Market. A jam is held there on the fourth Friday of each month.

The Elmira Grange was built in 1927 and is a charming venue. There is a photo of District 6 jammers on their web page. The Elmira jam is on the second Friday of each month.



grandmother. "Dad and Granddad bought a farm together. Neighbors would come over and play. It struck a chord with me. At dances, Granddad played fiddle, and Grandmother played piano. There was a love of that music among both sides of the family. An uncle was the New Mexico state champ and competed at Weiser." Gynn played violin herself in elementary school orchestra in Arizona.

Gynn and Jim heard the oldtime fiddlers at the fairgrounds in Roseburg. For years, they ran the kitchen and banguet at the convention. "We made some of the best friends of our lives." Jim was Vice President in 1982-83, and Gynn was SecretaryTreasurer from 1979-81 and 1985-89. "We went to Weiser every year so the guy running Pioneer Days in Canyonville asked me to be a fiddle contest judge. I took over organizing it in 1971, and it went for 40 years. The school trusted me with the premises. I'm sad about the contest ending, but contest day was getting too hard on us physically. The Pioneer Days Committee didn't want to see it end, but there was so much going on during Pioneer Days that we didn't get the crowd we needed. OOTFA people still wanted and supported it. We just couldn't get anyone locally to organize and take over the work of contest day." Now, Gynn spends a lot of time working with the Pioneer Museum and writing grants. For many years, she's also been District 10's Treasurer and has done the yearend audits of all the districts.

In April, the only birthday I know of is mine on the 26th. How time flies when you're having fun! I'm surprised we don't have more in April. If we don't have your special days, please let one of us know
