FROM THE EDITOR EMERITUS

Telling stories is a part of the aging process so here I go. Let me take you back to 1884 when my Grandfather Trotter as a 14-year-old worked all summer to buy a fiddle. He died in 1948. My mother gave her father's fiddle to me 1976. About that time Alice and I were intrigued by an article in the local Coos Bay paper that told about the fiddlers playing at the Cranberry Festival in Bandon, so we went down to hear some old time fiddle music. When John Hoerster was introduced as MC, he told that he restored fiddles, so after the program I went to him to tell him about the old fiddle I had that needed repair. He told me that he would be glad to work on it. Sometime later Alice and I drove over to John's place in Roque River with the fiddle. While we were there, we were introduced to Les McLeod from Bandon who was visiting John. Little did we realize that meeting John and Les in 1976 would change our lives even until this day. Much as eating keeps us going, so does fiddling. John restored my grandfather's fiddle so the challenge was there to learn to play a tune.

We went to Bandon to District 5 jams and joined OOTFA about 1979. The snowball got bigger and bigger as we went to our first state convention in Roseburg in 1982. For several

summers, we attended OOTFA fiddle campouts near Vernonia where we met many of Oregon's fiddlers. In 1984 after I had retired, we attended the Martha Warwick campout near Williams. Both Vernonia and Warwick's were great musical and social experiences that got us deeply engrossed in OOTFA and fiddling.

All of this is to say that inheriting a fiddle could lead to meeting lots of great people, opportunities to travel, as well as many

hours of pleasure.

Tune of the Month Suggested by Melinda Grant (District 4)

'Breaking Up Christmas' is a widely played old time standard. It refers to a tradition in the Blue Ridge Mountains that involves a 12-day celebration between Christmas and January 6, the day known as "Old Christmas" or Epiphany. This old Christmas party tradition originated in the 1920s and comes from the areas of Northwest North Carolina in Surry County and nearby Southwest Virginia. Before the days of television and electricity, people would gather for the twelve days between Christmas and January 6 for socializing, food, dancing, and old-time string music. The event would move from house to house and the party would go on past midnight. Thus the people "broke up" Christmas into many days of shared celebration.

This tune is best played in cross-A: AEAE. Tune your G string up to an A and your D string up to an E. (Some people don't like to tune strings higher, so you can instead tune your A string down to a G and your E string down to a D, GDGD.) And of course it can be played out of straight tuning (but it won't sound as good!) Part B is a rhythmic riff, so give yourself time to get into the groove. A zillion great vids of this on YouTube; be sure to watch the one of Tommy Jarrell - awesome! And if you search YouTube for Breaking Up Christmas and Erynn Marshall or Sophie's Sunday Fiddlers, you'll find a couple of great tutorials. And you don't have to wait for Christmas, this one is played year round.

MEMORIES OF CLARENCE "WHITEY" KELM

Another leaf has fallen. Clarence "Whitey" Kelm of District 10 passed away early in the morning on November 20. "Whitey" was born on December 7, 1930.
