

Editor Emeritus

Let's travel back to November 13, 1981 so I can tell you about one fiddling experience that was unique...... On the TV and radio, they were forecasting a major storm, with wind speeds comparable with the Columbus Day storm of 1962. How could it be true when it was so calm outside with wind no higher than on a typical summer afternoon?

We left about 5 o'clock that evening to pick up Max and on to fiddle at Dew Valley Community Hall south of Bandon. The wind came up, but Alice and I laughed it off. In the next few hours, the wind began to put on a show. The little old community hall shook--not from the fiddlers, but rather from the wind. The lights went out about 8:30 in the evening. We faked it with flashlights until Claude went home to get his generator. One lamp supplied us with light. We played for a while, but not with the usual spirit.

When I went out to get the car about 10 p.m. to head for home, I could really feel and hear the force of the wind. It was strong. We dropped Max off and then headed for North Bend at 10:30. As we approached the south side of Bandon, we could see the flashing red lights of police cars. A state police car was parked across the highway. An officer walked backward into the wind to tell us, "Turn back" – nothing more than to turn back. We went

back a mile and turned west on the beach loop road. The gusts were really whipping, but they did not cause us too much concern. We talked to an OSP in Bandon who advised us not to go to Coos Bay. But we did.

After we started north, the wind was to our back. On several occasions we dodged fallen trees on the highway. Two had red flares. It did not rain, but the wind was blowing leaves past us faster than we were driving.

Back home, Ray met us in the driveway at 11:30 p.m. to tell us that our bathroom window was broken. I replaced the window in the shop that was broken and then Alice and I nailed plastic over the bathroom window. A little after midnight, the North Bend police called to ask me if I would report to the Coast Guard to organize some ham radio operators and help them until they restored their radio communications. We went to bed about 12:30 – I could hear both radios. At 1:30 a.m., it dawned on me that everything was quiet. The electricity had gone off. Later that night a CG helicopter went down killing the commander.

It was a night to remember. Fiddling in Oregon has brought us a lifetime of memories and friends, as well as some unexpected adventures.

"Johnny's Lover's Gone" Suggested by Melinda Grant (District 4)


