2023 OOTFA Convention Workshops

Fiddle

FIDDLE ADULT BEGINNING FIDDLE with Kelly Wadsworth

Always dreamed of playing fiddle? This class is for you. No experience needed. We'll start from the very beginning! Need a violin? We can solve that problem too... call me for information! 541 643 7113. (beginner)

YOUTH FIDDLE with Kelly Wadsworth (beginner/intermediate) We invite all youth to join us for an intro to fiddling. If you play with an orchestra, or just want to branch out a little, you will enjoy this class. We'll learn a couple tunes, practice a few scales (the key to playing by ear), and become familiar with some standard fiddle rhythms. Rosin' up your bow and come on down!

IRISH FIDDLE with Dave Altman What are the tune categories for "Irish Fiddle?" This year's workshop will be an introduction to what constitutes the categories if you want to hang out with an Irish jam at any level. Depending on time constraints and interest, we will learn a tune to practice hearing each category, starting with Slow Airs, Double Jigs, Slip Jigs, Hornpipes, Marches, and Reels. (intermediate/advanced)

ADDING DOUBLE STOPS for fiddle with Allison Lindley In this workshop we will apply drone notes, and one and two finger chords to add fullness and old-timey flavor: Westphalia Waltz G, Kentucky Waltz C, Soldiers Joy D. Handouts to take home: Old Joe Clark A, Bile them Cabbage Down A, First 3 notes of Faded Love D, Last time variation through Goodbye Liza Jane G, Ida Red A, and The Yellow Rose of Texas D. (advanced beginner/intermediate)

RAGS FOR FIDDLE with Judy McGarvey Learn a couple old-time rags. Why, what and how -- and we'll make the hall swing (advanced beginner/intermediate)

POLKAS FOR FIDDLE with Judy McGarvey Learn some lively polkas to get your audience dancing. All levels of play. Let's have fun. (advanced beginner/intermediate)

CONTEST FIDDLING with Starr McMullen Playing in a contest can be intimidating, especially for the first time. However, preparing to play in a contest will improve your fiddling overall by making you work on tone, rhythm, and overall fiddle feel. In this workshop Starr McMullen, two-time National Fiddling Champion and veteran contestant and fiddle judge, will answer your questions and provide advice on how to best present your fiddling. Participants should come with a proposed three tune round (Hoedown, Waltz, and tune of choice other than a waltz or hoedown) for discussion and possible demonstration. (intermediate/ advanced)

FIDDLE CLINIC: IDEAS, PROBLEMS, SOLUTIONS with Linda Danielson Let's explore what you've been playing lately, what's been giving you problems, what you've learned about the fiddle that you could share to help somebody else. What's a good tune you've learned and why is it good? What happens when your bow squeaks and shudders? Why do your shoulders hurt when you play? Is there an easier way to do the hard stuff?--or anything else you want to talk about. It's an open roundtable. (all levels)

Guitar

GUITAR BASS RUNS ON THE GUITAR with Jerry Parks A few simple bass runs when going between chords can really add to the sound of your rhythm playing. In this workshop we'll cover several of these simple runs that can be used when playing in any key. We'll work on these with vocals and fiddle tunes. (advanced beginner/intermediate)

GUITAR BACKUP with Frank Moore Behind every successful musician is a great backup band. The fiddle player is the boss and director. Learn how to play backup guitar so the boss looks great and the performance shines. (intermediate/advanced)

SWING GUITAR/MOVABLE CHORDS FOR GUITAR with Nancy Yialouris This class will offer moveable chord forms for experienced and competent players who want to move out of the first 3 frets and enrich their repertoire. Must have a good ear to hear chord changes. It will be light on theory and long on listening. We will cover 4-5 swing tunes depending on time. If you hear a tune on media and can sit down and play what you heard, this class is for you! (intermediate/advanced)

Mandolin

CHORDS FOR MANDOLIN with Dave Altman Mandolins can often be great backup instruments for Old-Time fiddle music. Chords can be sharp and crisp to provide the steady beat and percussion for string groups. This session will give practical information to create chords with 2, 3, or 4 finger configurations. We will cover all major keys and their minor or "crooked" companion keys. (beginner/intermediate)

TWIN AND TRIPLE MANDOLIN with Joe Ross Explore the joys of playing twin and triple mandolin parts for common fiddle tunes like Ashoken Farewell, Snow Deer, Red Wing, Soldier's Joy, Red Haired Boy, Far Away, Liberty, St. Anne's Reel, March of St. Timothy and more. Using tablature, we'll play through several tunes to get comfortable with using a descant or harmony to embellish a jam and complement others' playing. By workshop's end, we'll sound like a well-greased mandolin orchestra. Fiddlers are welcome to bring their mandolins. (intermediate/advanced: must read tabs)

DOUBLE STOPS ON MANDOLIN with Bill O'Sullivan Learn basic fundamentals of building and using double stops in a simple chord progression. We'll learn the relationships of the different 2 chord positions. We'll also learn to use the positions to play up the neck. Some very basic theory will be covered. (beginner/intermediate)

Bass

BEGINNING BASS with Joe Ross Get started on the BIG fiddle and be the coolest player of the band. (beginner)

Dance

DANCE TO OLDTIME MUSIC with Jerry and Linda Parks Get out on the dance floor and have some fun. Learn some smooth moves you can try when not being in the band. (all levels)



fayette was popularized by **Kirk McGee** in the 1960s. Kirk was a regular fiddler on the **Grand Ole Opry** at that time, and according to the **The Fiddler's Companion**, Kirk said in an interview

The origin of this tune is

in 1965 that the tune was "an old Civil War tune." I learned this version in the 1970s from an Oregon fiddler who we would play with occasionally, **Ruthie Dornfeld.** When I play Lafayette, it feels like this tune works well using the Georgia shuffle bowing pattern in various parts. Also, the only recording from online research that sounded similar to me can be found at https://www.slippery-hill.com/content/lafayette or by typing "slippery-hill lafayette" in your search engine.
