Valley Fiddle Contest

2023 Willamette This year's Willamette Valley Fiddle Contest will be held Friday, August 4, 2023, at the **Benton** County Fair in Corvallis, Oregon. This will be the 24th year the contest has been held at this location.

It is the second longest running fiddle contest in the state of Oregon and the only one held at a county fair! The **Oak Grove Stage** provides a partially shaded venue for spectators and there are lots of fun activities at the fair for the whole family!

The contest attracts fiddle players from across the country (and has even had participants from Italy and Japan!) In addition to National Championship fiddlers, the contest also has a unique Novice Division for fiddlers of any age who have never played in a contest before. This is the time for those who have been thinking about playing to get their fiddles out and tunes polished!

All contestants must play a hoedown, a waltz, and a tune of choice other than a

hoedown or waltz. Contestants in the Novice and PeeWee Divisions (8 and under) only play one set of tunes. For all other divisions, there is one preliminary round in which all contestants play and the top five from each Division play a second set of tunes in the finals. Age divisions are: PeeWee (8 and under) Junior-Junior (9-12), Junior (13-17), Adult (18-59) and Senior (60+). Fiddlers may play either in their age division OR in the Championship Division (which is open to anyone and pays more prize money!)

This event exists solely to promote and preserve an old-time fiddle tradition in Oregon. Put it on your calendar!

Chance's goals and aspirations are to become the next Charlie Daniels in the music scene and Aarun is just the instructor to get him to that level. Chance has a lineup of hard-hitting country and Texas style tunes that Aarun is working him through. Along with his fiddling skills, Chance is becoming guite a performer. He has a full sound system set up so he can electrify his fiddle, foot board for control pedals, mic and Blu-toothed speaker. He has a growing library of backtracks that he plays and sings with, so he spends hours learning how to fiddle and sing with unlimited number of performers, bands and doing solos.

Thirteen-year-old Sydney Pierce is a smooth fiddler that picks up bowing technique faster than fast. Her favorite fiddling genera are Celtic and Old-Time so there are many bowing styles in that music that only young people can master and master it she has. Megan may have played it in one of her rounds at the Oregon State Contest where she placed second in the Junior-Junior Division.

The hornpipe (2/4 time) in G major is credited to **Harry Carleton** in Ryan's Mammoth Collection (1883). A "Sally Growler" is a particular unattractive Atlantic coast bottom-dwelling fish (aka Sea Raven,

Toadfish, Oyster Cracker or Horsehead). It was so named, according to the New York Zoological Society in 1919, "because of its habit of growling on occasion, like a puppy on a bone." In Ryan's collection, the tune was in quotation marks so it's possible it was really named after a boat or seaport bar named for the fish.

The hornpipe was picked up by fiddlers around the US, particularly in Texas. It occasionally surfaces in fiddle contests. This setting of the tune is from fiddler **Benny Thomasson**, as published in The Phillips Collection of Traditional American Fiddle Tunes, Vol. 2.




